Suicide prevention panel

The Canadian Mental Health Association is presenting Talk for Life - Talk for Hope, What we can do to Prevent Suicide.

On Monday, a panel representing family members, community agencies, hospitals and survivors will share their experiences on the subject at Our Lady of Grace Church in Aurora, 15437 Yonge St., from 7 to 8:30 p.m.

Keynote speaker will be Markham's Michelle Chouinard. She will talk about her brother Louis who committed suicide in 1997, and will share what her family has learned in the hope that other families can avoid such pain and loss.

Other presentations include How to Build a Personal Support System, Recognizing the Warning Signs and How to

get Help. The Hospital - Where to Go and How They can Help, and The Importance of Learning and Coping.

The walk is part of Violence Prevention Week and highlights the connection between cruelty to animals and human violence.

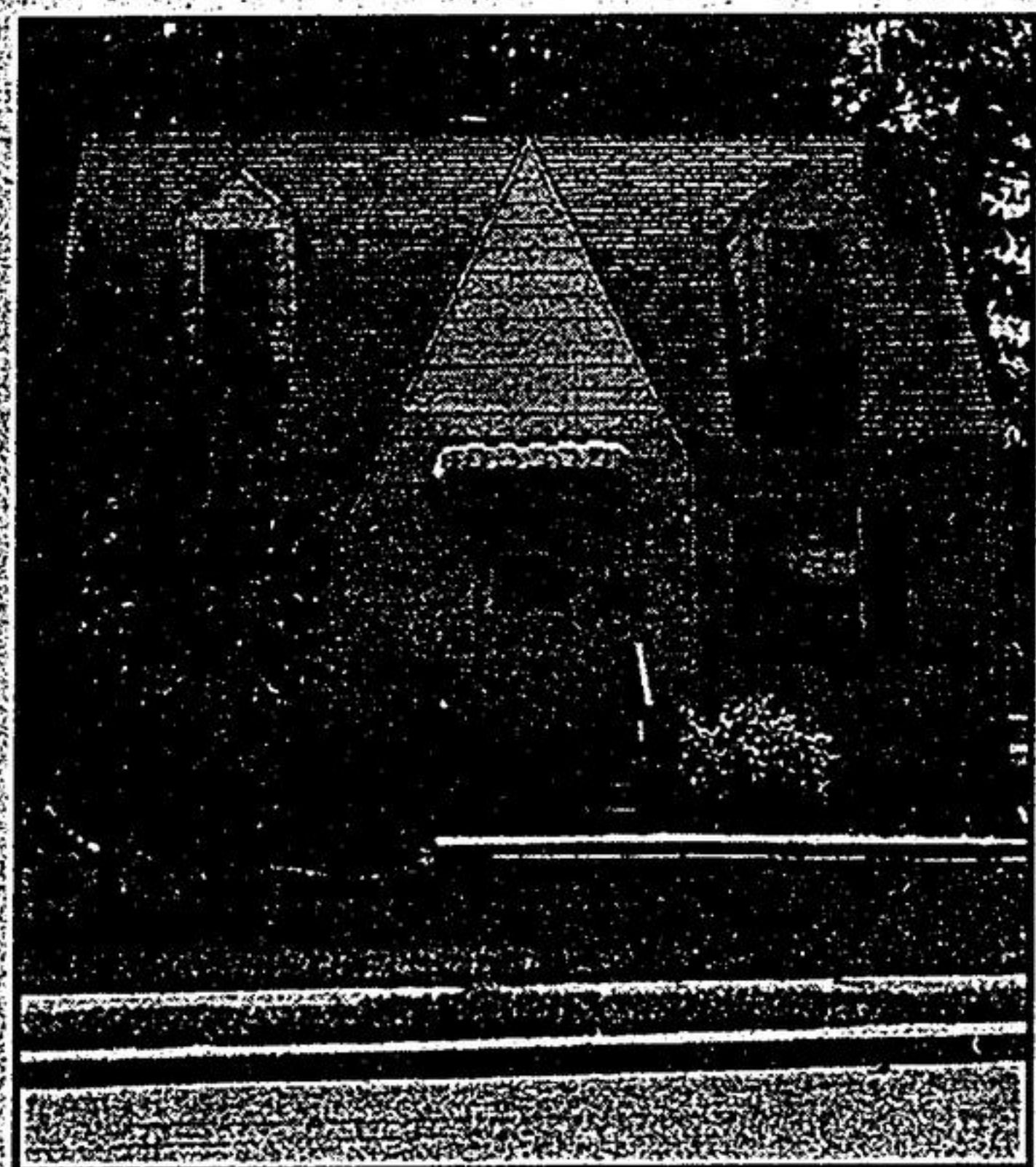
