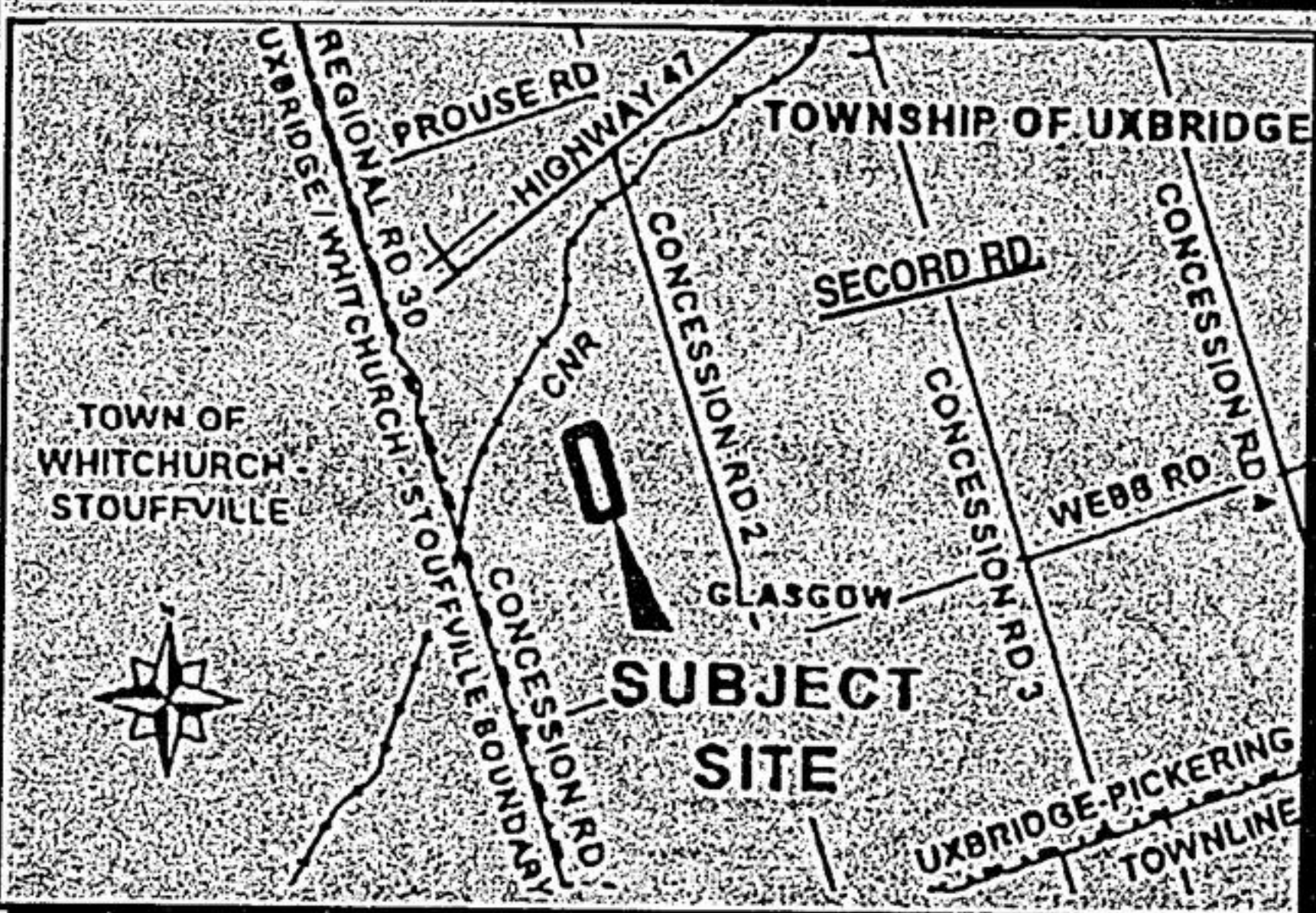

APPEAL
