Spooky thrills await you at haunted adventure

Strange and scary things are happening in Stouffville.

The Haunted Adventure at Magic Hill Farm on the Ninth Line has returned for its seventh year.

The adventure includes a 2.2-kilometre haunted hayride through 100 acres of forest on a covered wagon, and a 20-minute walk through the farm's 150-year-old haunted barn.

"A cheap thrill is to have a dark barn where people keep bumping into walls," said Grandpa, creator of the Haunted Adventure.

"Our barn is semi-lit so you can always see."

Grandpa describes the adventure as a combination of magic, illusion, and scare.

One of the main attractions features a young man dressed as a lumberjack who manifests into a werewolf right before the visitor's eyes.

A former magician, Grandpa said his experience in the realm of magic has helped make his Haunted Adventure a success.

"Being a magician, I am able to use special effects in both the field and the barn so that people go away shaking their heads saying 'how did they do that?' as well as saying 'boy, did that scare me.'"

For \$3 more, guests can also visit the Spook Show Theatre, featuring local magician Tom Baxter.

"Unfortunately we can't say it's open to everyone because with 2,000 people visiting a night, there is no guarantee everybody will get in," Grandpa said.

He said the Haunted Adventure features something different each year in order to cater to repeat visitors.

And the adventure makes a great family outing. "There isn't a lot of families can do with their teenage children these days," he said.

On busy nights, Grandpa will work the lines by performing magic tricks, trivia contests, and comedy acts.

The adventure also features a "munch house," where visitors can buy coffee, hot chocolate, hot dogs, and other snacks.

"People only get to go on each ride once, but they can sit around the firepit and munch on food," he said. "We don't kick anybody out."

The Haunted Adventure is open every Friday and Saturday in October, as well as Sunday Oct. 18 and 25, from dark to 11 p.m.

It is not recommended for children who are under eight years old, pregnant women, or people with heart problems. The adventure costs \$14 for 12 years and older, and \$9 for those eight years old to 11. Parking is free.

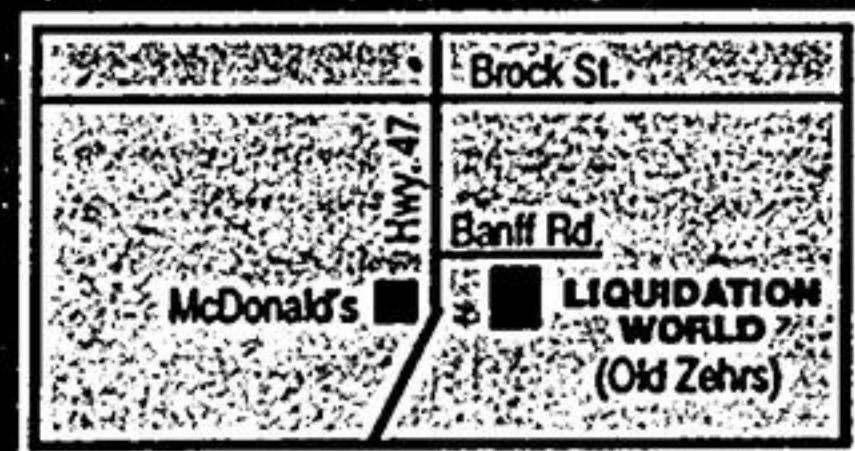
