Mabley is a busy hockey mom

Leslie Mabley would rather see her sons on the ice than on the streets.

That's why she's spent the past decade driving the three boys from one southern Ontario arena to another while fashioning the family schedule almost entirely around hockey from September through April.

Leslie and her husband, Peter, are parents to 10-year-old Luke, 14-year-old Jordan and PJ, 17.

The trio are playing out of three different towns this season. Luke is with the Stouffville minor atom Clippers while Jordan is a member of the Richmond Hill AAA minor bantam Stars, and PJ, the Uxbridge Bruins of the Central Ontario Junior C Hockey League.

Already, the new season has seen Leslie stretched to the limit.

A recent weekend saw the boys playing in a total of eight games in arenas from Stouffville to Gravenhurst. In addition, Jordan and PJ held responsibilities as timekeeper and referee respectively at a local tournament.

The next weekend saw the Mabley road show touch down in Uxbridge, Keswick, Brampton, Welland and Richmond Hill, as well as the rec centre.

"We saw all their games," Leslie says with a sense of satisfaction. "It's tricky, but there's a knack to it."

She suggests a map book of Ontario's arenas kept in the family vehicle, along with access to Hwy 407, can prove invaluable at times.

Leslie keeps track of every game and practice on a large blotter calendar.

"The first thing I do when I get up every morning is look at the schedule for that day," says

Leslie. "There was someone on the ice every day in September after the Labour Day weekend."

She concedes there are times things get out of hand.

"We had 23 games in 14 days during the Christmas holidays last year. I lost my sense of humour."

While Leslie takes on the bulk of the duties of getting the boys to and from their games, her husband is available for spot duty.

"Peter runs his own business

so if push comes to shove he can leave if he has to."

Leslie acknowledges family time is hard to come by for the Mabley clan during the hockey season. But at the end of each hockey season, the Mableys take a one-week family vacation.

The pace may be hectic and homework assignments are sometimes left uncompleted. However, it's all for the good insists Leslie, who has worked as a foster parent relief worker with

the Children's Aid Society since before she was married.

"The more down time kids have, it seems the more destructive they are," she says.

She insists young people need an activity to keep them on track whether it be hockey, dancing or music.

"It keeps them out of negative peer groups."

Leslie suggests she was an arena junkie long before she took on the job of chauffeur for her sons. As a child growing up in Richmond Hill she was forever watching her three brothers play hockey.

She says her role as a 'hockey mom' is something she truly enjoys, despite the sometimes-frantic pace.

But she admits to having a problem with nail biting during key games involving her sons' teams. She said her corridor pacing is known to all.

"The other players on the team will see me leave and say, 'There goes your mom'. I seem to have developed a unique reputation."


Leslie insists that neither she nor her husband, a veteran coach and past president with the Whitchurch-Stouffville Minor Hockey Association, bring pressure to bear on their kids to perform at an unrealistic level.

"We don't yell at them. This isn't about making it to the NHL or the OHL. I just think they learn good moral values in sports."

Leslie, who sat on the WSMHA executive for two years and has been involved with the organization for years in a volunteer capacity, says she and Peter ask just one thing of their sons.

"The only rule about their hockey is that they work hard at the game. They've all shown their interest and they're good team players."
