the age recommended on the package.

- Some makeup contains spirit gum adhesive, a flammable substance. Keep makeup containers away from open flames, such as pilot lights and candles.

York Regional Police advise you to make sure your kids know the rules of the road before they leave the house.

- Cross the streets only at corners, never between parked cars or diagonally across intersections.
- Look in all directions before crossing the street.
- Obey all traffic signals.
- Walk, never run, across the street.
- Walk on the sidewalk, not on the road. If your trick-or-treat route is in a neighbourhood without any sidewalks, walk on the left side, facing traffic.
- When waiting to cross the street, stay on the sidewalk.

Safety Rules

- Young children should be accompanied by an adult or a responsible older child.
- Make sure that your children understand that they are not to eat anything before you have examined their treats carefully. Feed them just before taking them out trick-or-treating so they won't be as tempted to snack, or furnish them with treats from home to eat on route.
- Outline exactly where your children may go. Keeping to your own neighbourhood is best.
- Your children should be firmly told to visit people they know and never enter a stranger's home or apartment without an adult.
- Instruct your children not to accept unwrapped, homemade or unfamiliar treats, and to never accept anything from strangers.
