

Local players bear down with Uxbridge Bruins

A pair of Stouffville minor hockey products have found happiness in Uxbridge.

Thanks in part to the efforts of PJ Mabley and Cory Turchan, the Uxbridge Bruins are off to their fastest OHA Central Junior C Hockey League start in recent years.

Through its first nine games this season, the Bruins sit in first place in the six-team league with an 8-1 mark.

Mabley, a former Stouffville Clipper, amassed eight points in the Bruins' first six games. The fast-skating centre has seen some action on the power play and has also been used to kill penalties.

A forward last season with the Stouffville midget Clippers, Turchan now toils on the blueline and has racked up seven points in the team's first six outings.

"We put him back on defence by necessity one night and we liked what we saw," said Bruins' general manager Ron Archibald.

Turchan, who has played defence in past years, is a regular point man on the

Bruins' power play.

"Both players have made a big contribution," said Archibald. "They've fit in quite nicely here."

Mabley is one of four players to come to the Bruins via the Spirit of Stouffville. The Provincial Junior A Hockey League club established an affiliation with the Bruins for the current season.

Mabley, along with Bruins players Trevor Dawes and Brad Moore, skated with the Spirit during training camp. Ricky Rideout, who was cut adrift after playing with the Spirit last year, is also with the Bruins.

The Spirit have used the services of Bruins goalkeeper Ian Watson for one game this season.

Bruins' head coach Jason Underwood and his assistant Paul MacEwen, fill out the Stouffville connection. Both have coached and played in Stouffville.

The Bruins play their home games Fridays at 7:45 p.m. at the Uxbridge Arena.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC CONSULTATION WORKSHOP

NINTH LINE (Y.R. 69) IMPROVEMENTS FROM FUTURE HIGHWAY 407 TO MAIN STREET (STOUFFVILLE) MUNICIPAL CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT (SCHEDULE C)

Cole, Sherman & Associates Ltd. has been retained by the Region of York to undertake a study to improve Ninth Line from Highway 407 to Main Street in Whitchurch-Stouffville to Regional standards.

The purpose of this project is to alleviate existing and anticipated future traffic problems associated with development in the Towns of Markham and Whitchurch-Stouffville.

As part of this study, the elimination of road jogs at bisecting east-west roads will be considered as well as investigating improvement options of the existing jog at Main Street.

This project is classified as a Schedule "C" undertaking by the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Road Projects (Class "EA"). Two workshops are scheduled for this project. The first has now been scheduled. The second is tentatively scheduled for Winter 1999. Once this study is complete, an Environmental Assessment Report will be compiled and placed on the public record.

Public consultation is an essential part of the planning process and members of the public are encouraged to attend the Workshops.

The purpose of this Workshop is to introduce the study and obtain comments on the problem statement and the alternatives that will be considered. Workshop participants will also determine the level of importance given to project issues to assist in identifying a preferred alternative.

A second workshop is tentatively scheduled for Winter 1999. The purpose of this workshop will be to review the evaluation of alternatives and the preferred alternative.
