The choral group had performed on behalf of community projects over the years, and has been a regular participant in Markham's Christmas tree lighting ceremony.

The final performance of the choir will be Sunday evening at 7:30 p.m. at Brown's Corner United Church, at Hwy. 7 and Woodbine Avenue. Admission is free.

The choir was formed in 1980, and its members met at Miles' home on Cachet Parkway (where the group got its name). Invitations to perform grew steadily, and

recently the choir has averaged six to eight concerts a year.

Miles has decided to spend more time with her family and has some retirement activities lined up.
