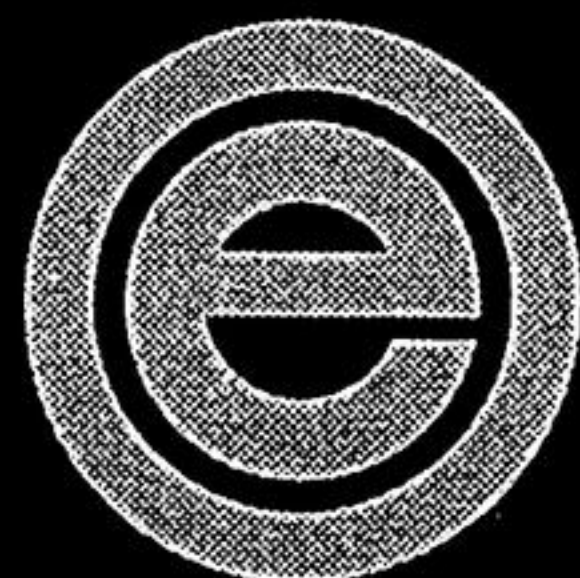

CRIME

Stouffville liquor store robbed, again

Stouffville's Main Street liquor store, the site of a recent "smash-and-grab" break-in, was robbed in a similar way again this week.

The thieves smashed a glass door to get in about 6:15 p.m. Sunday evening, York Regional Police said.

The intruders took about \$700 worth of inventory, the store manager said yesterday.

Another such theft occurred around Thanksgiving weekend.

THIEVES TRIED ROBBING THREE

Thieves took computer equipment early Tuesday morning from a pair of businesses in a Kennedy Road building in Markham. Police said they fled, however after breaking into a third business with an alarm.

In all three establishments, the culprits pried open a front door. Equipment of unknown value was taken from a realtor's office, which suffered \$1,000 in damages, and from an accountant's office, with \$600 in damages caused.

The third business, a law office, also suffered \$600 in damage, police said, but an alarm there scared the culprits off at about 2:30 a.m.

COMPUTERS STOLEN

Thieves robbed \$12,000 worth of computers from offices in a Steelcase Road West building in Markham early yesterday morning.

To get to them, the intruders first smashed a set of doors and then a window to gain entry to the lobby around 12:30 a.m., police said.

About \$3,000 in damages were reported.

INTRUDERS FLEE OWNER

Police said two would-be thieves shouldered the front door of a home Monday afternoon on Wincanton Road in Markham, but fled when confronted by the owner.

Nothing was taken and there was no physical contact, although \$300 in damage was caused, police said.

The two male intruders drove away around 1:30 p.m. in a light brown panel van.
