Without his ongoing help, it would be very difficult to maintain the spirit of an Olde Tyme Christmas Parade and many more children would need to walk.

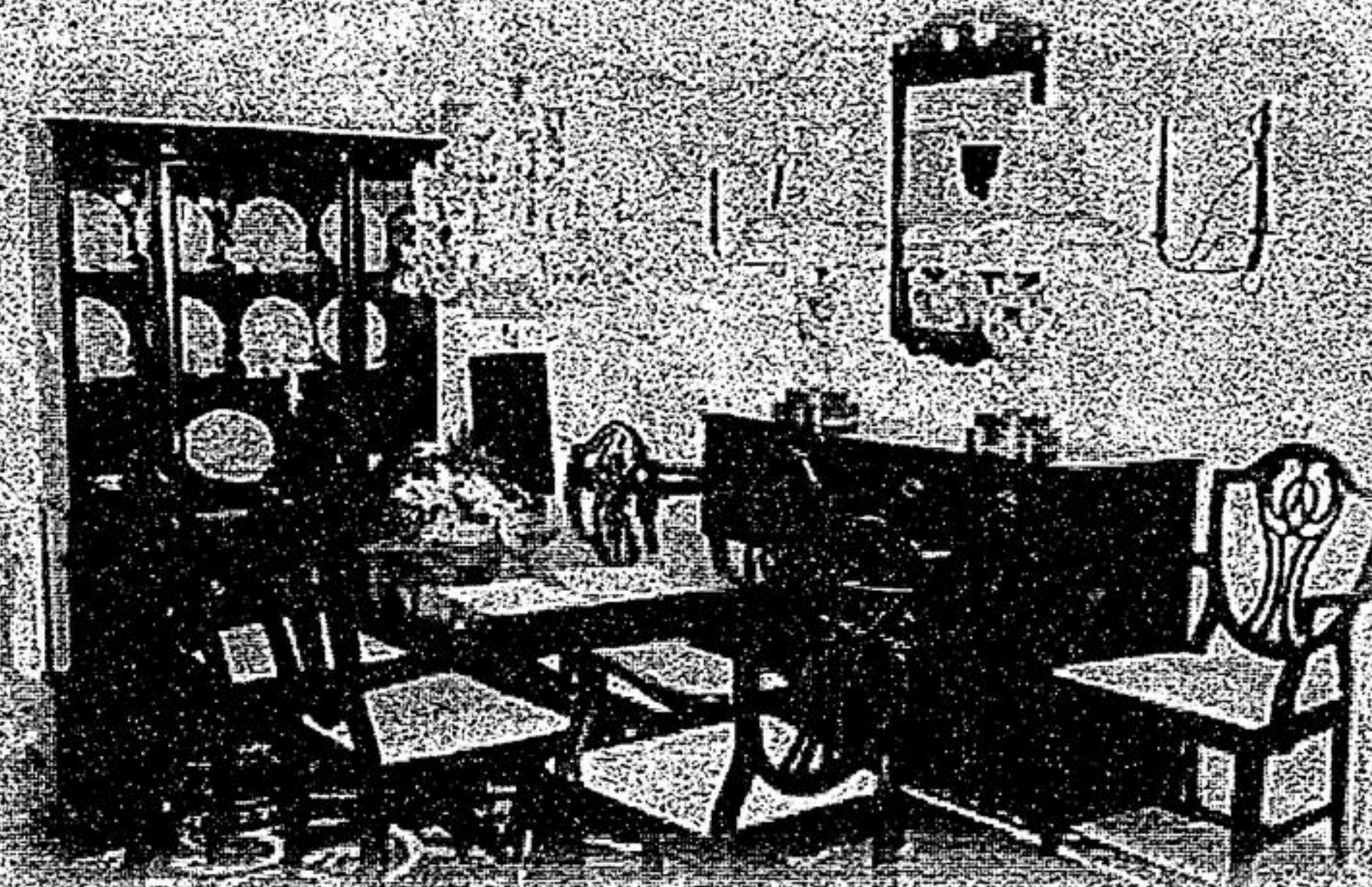
Once the parade is over, stay on the
