# Expenses are in

Mayor Wayne Emmerson and Ward 5 Councillor Judy Scala were the big spenders last year.

Emmerson, who earns an annual municipal salary of \$22,306, plus salary from the region, filed a \$3,650 car allowance bill along with a \$1,975 public relations bill for 1998.

Each of the town's six councillors received \$13,740 in salary along with \$1,043 in car allowance.

Scala, meanwhile, spent \$1,060 on public relations, compared to \$900 spent by Ward 3 Councillor Peter Dobrich, \$820 by Ward 1 Councillor Steve Pliakes, \$475 by Ward 4 Councillor Cliff Dunkeld, \$375 by Ward 2 Councillor Mark Carroll and \$250 for Ward 6 Councillor Sue Sherban.

Council's remuneration and expense bill totaled \$134,650 in 1998.

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## EXPROPRIATIONS ACT
