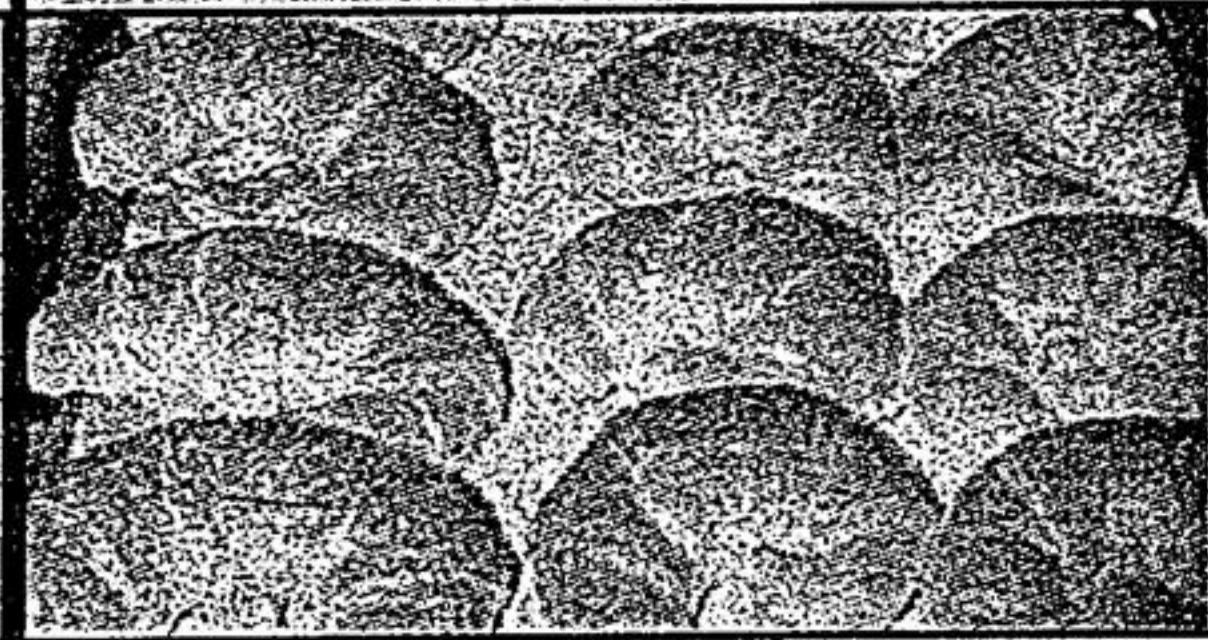

## Ontario has come a long way: Harris

"The election will be decided on streets like these across Ontario," Harris said.

"Inside, I listened to these people tell me how much better things are for them four years later. Four years ago, Ontario had the highest tax rates in the country, the largest number of welfare recipients per capita, unfair job quotas and record deficit of \$11 billion.

"Our program of lower taxes, putting money into priority services, cutting red tape and making government work for people instead of the other way around has restored Ontario as the economic engine of Canada."

Harris said he had only finalized the decision yesterday morning. "Yesterday was the fifth anniversary of the announcement of the Common Sense Revolution, but that's not why, in particular. It's been four years ... it's time."

The premier cited the Tories' election document, Blueprint.

"It includes a 20-per-cent cut in provincial income tax rates and the provincial share of property tax reform, expanded work for welfare and improved quality of education through teacher competency testing. We've come a long way in the past four years, but we still have a long way to go."

As protesters sang, "Hey, hey, ho — Mike Harris must go" and "Bye, bye, Mike," Harris was asked how he would respond to people who disagreed with his policies.

"Some people find their own way to cheer me on," he said, before being rushed inside his campaign bus.

A press release from the premier's office, faxed half an hour before the conference was scheduled to begin, stated Harris would visit the home to "discuss the new provincial budget with Ms. Mason and some of her friends and neighbours".

Mason said she had been advised two weeks ago that Harris would be coming to call yesterday.

"I didn't know for sure he would be calling the election today," she said, "but with the budget coming down the day before, it wasn't hard to figure it out."
