McDonald's supports Mullings fund

Mother's Day proceeds to help widow and baby

McDonald's is rallying behind a young widow this Mother's Day.

Four McDonald's restaurants will donate 50 cents from every order of French fries sold this Sunday to the Mullings and Baby Trust Fund. In addition, cash or cheque donations will be welcomed and forwarded to the account.

Kennedy McKenzie Steven Jackson was born Jan. 21 at Markham Stouffville Hospital. The following day, a car crash on Main Street, Stouffville, claimed the life of his father, Steven Jackson, and seriously injured his mother, Angelina Mullings.

Mullings' injuries included a fractured skull, a broken pelvis, a broken ankle and five broken ribs. As well, the head injury caused temporary speech and vision problems. Mullings is now at home in Stouffville with Kennedy and undergoing physiotherapy.

Mullings will mark her first Mother's Day on her 29th birthday May 9.

The Mullings and Baby Trust Fund was set up at the Stouffville Credit Union and more than \$30,000 has been donated.

Meanwhile, Stouffville resident Flora MacDonald co-ordinated a special caregiving program, in which volunteers help care for Kennedy and Mullings in their home.
