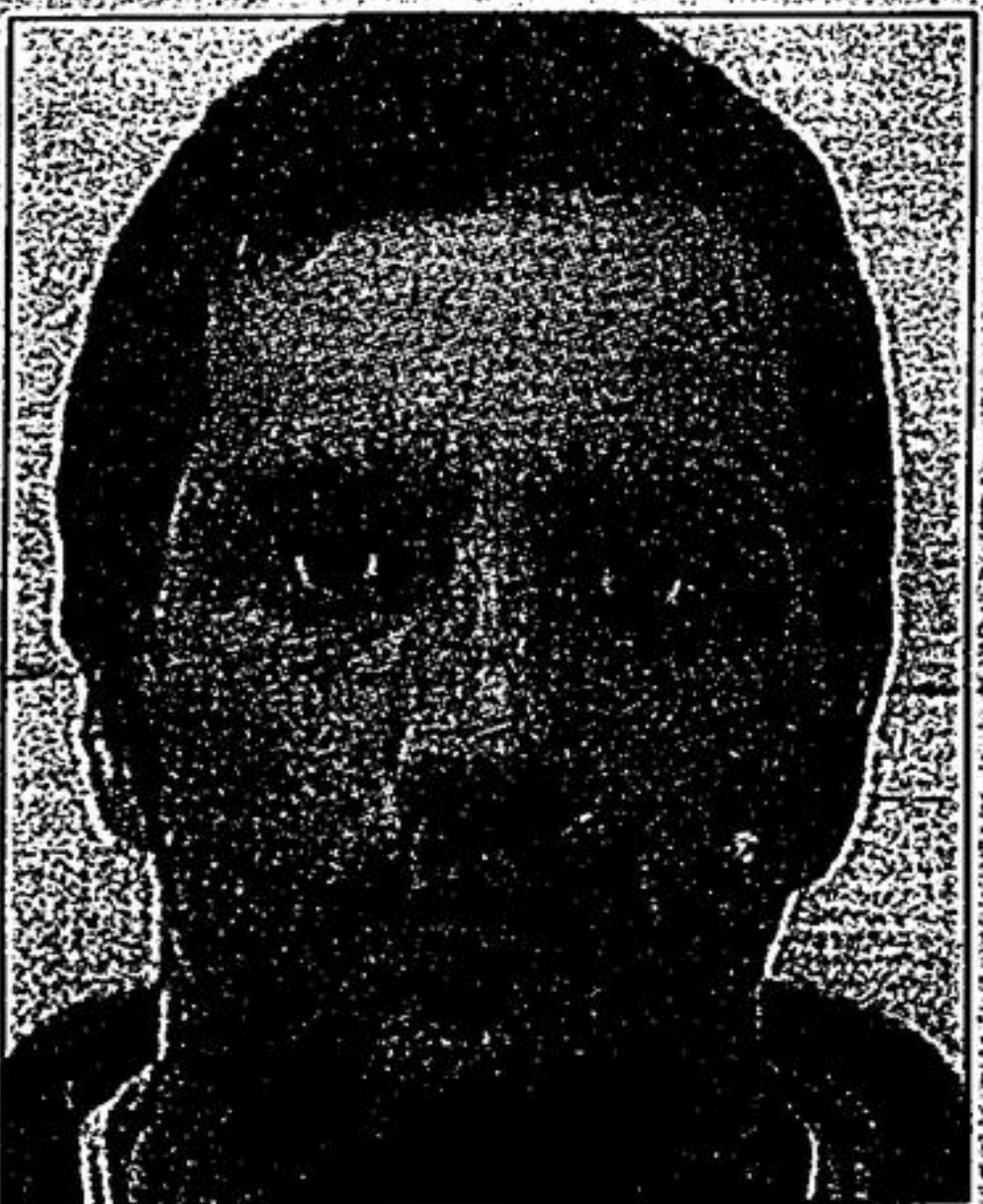

Search on for violent convict

A manhunt is under way for a Stouffville convict following his escape from the Toronto West Detention Centre Tuesday afternoon.

David Moir, 32, described by the Toronto police as violent and dangerous, fled from the Rexdale jail days before he was to be shipped to Kingston Penitentiary to begin a three-year sentence for committing a rash of break-ins in Stouffville and Markham last February.

While Moir's escape enters its fifth day, the public has come forward and is helping police in the effort to recapture Moir.

"We're getting leads and we're following up on every one of them," Toronto Det. Sgt. Chris White said.

"The leads are coming in through Crime Stoppers."

Stouffville escapes list

The search for a location to house York Region's waste management facility has been narrowed down to Richmond Hill and East Gwillimbury, the *Stouffville Tribune* has learned.

The region will officially announce the sites at a press conference Wednesday morning.

But a source who asked not to be identified said councillors agreed to the short list after a private get-together during Thursday's regional council meeting.

Regional chairperson Bill Fisch would only say council is contemplating purchasing one site in the northern part of the region and another in the south.

The official refused to pinpoint the exact locations but confirmed the site in Richmond Hill is just off Hwy. 404.

Earlier reports suggested the East Gwillimbury site is near Davis Drive and Hwy. 404.

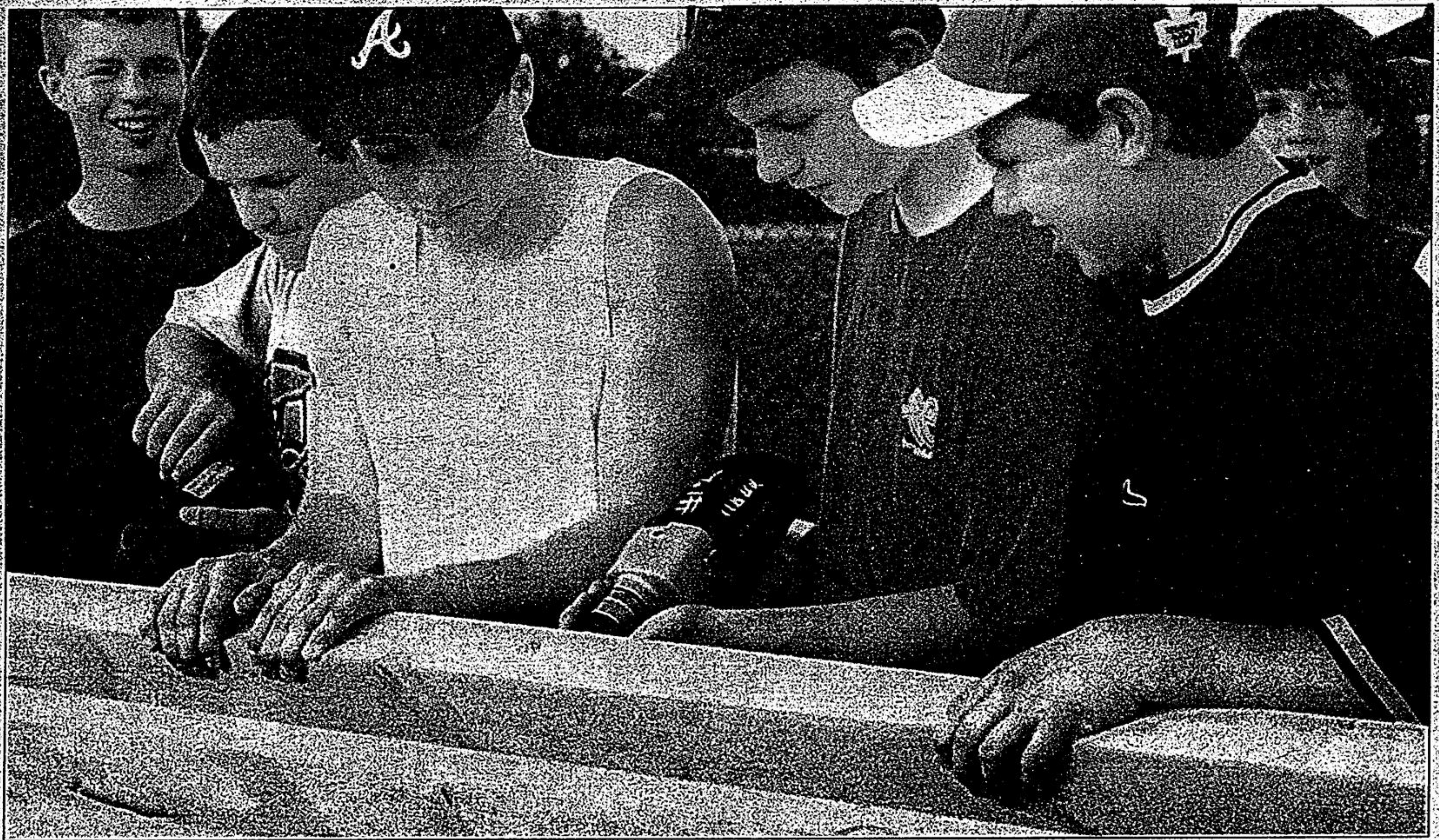
At the same time, the source said some politicians are skeptical about the project, especially the cost, estimated to be at least \$100 million.

Another official confirmed councillors still have a number of questions about the facility.

"At this point, I think it's very much up in the air."

The facility would handle recyclable materials collected in municipal blue box programs, compost kitchen waste and act as a transfer
