Suspect sought in Wong killing

Markham murder victim Maria Wong, stabbed to death in her Raymerville Drive garage in February, was targeted by her killers, police say.

They just can't say why. "We haven't determined a clear motive, but we have eliminated theft and robbery," said York Regional Police Det. Les Young at a press conference Tuesday. "We don't believe she knew the people, but she was targeted to be murdered."

Wong, 44, was slashed in the neck on Feb. 11 between 9:30 and 10:15 p.m.

Young released a composite sketch of his prime suspect, but said at least one other person was involved. "A number of witnesses saw the person in the composite and one other person," Young said, adding six or seven people have come forward, some only recently.

"We don't have enough of a description of the second person to make a composite. From the best we can tell, they waited for her to arrive home and open the (automatic) garage."

He said of the two, one man was seen constantly, while the man pictured in the composite disappeared from the street for a period of time.

A passer-by spotted Wong's lifeless body as he walked his dog just after 10 p.m. Her neck had been slashed and she had lost a great deal of blood.

Her sport utility vehicle, a

A green Honda CRV was recovered in the McDonald's parking lot at Hwy. 7 and McCowan Road four hours later. Her purse was still inside and police don't believe any of her belongings were stolen from her person, the garage or the car.

Young was peppered with questions from media about a possible motive.

"We don't believe race played any part at all," he said. "We have talked to people about Asian gang activities and it's not the way any expert we've spoken to describes a ritual execution pattern. An affair? Not that we know of, the family life appears quite good. We don't think it's a gang-related thing or a theft ring."

He said police were aware of

gambling debts incurred by Wong's husband, Shu Keun, but said they weren't excessive enough to be a motive for murder. The undisclosed amount of money was owed to casinos, not loan sharks, he added.

Wong's husband is in Hong Kong, but he still owns the Raymerville home and continues to be involved in business here, Young said.

"It's a situation where either she was targeted because of where she was earlier in the evening or because of her connections."

In the hours before she was killed, Wong attended an English as a second language class at Unionville Public Library, shopped at Loblaw's at Warden Avenue and Hwy. 7 at about 8:50 p.m., and picked up Chinese food in the Kennedy Road and Hwy. 7 area sometime after that.

"We know more than one person was involved and were hoping whoever that is, who maybe transported the vehicle, realizes we are not that far away from an arrest. We will be making an arrest and if someone was an accessory we hope they will do the right thing."

The man pictured is believed to be of Spanish or Mediterranean descent. He's about 20 years old, five-foot-nine-inches tall, about 165 pounds, with black hair, brown eyes and an olive complexion.

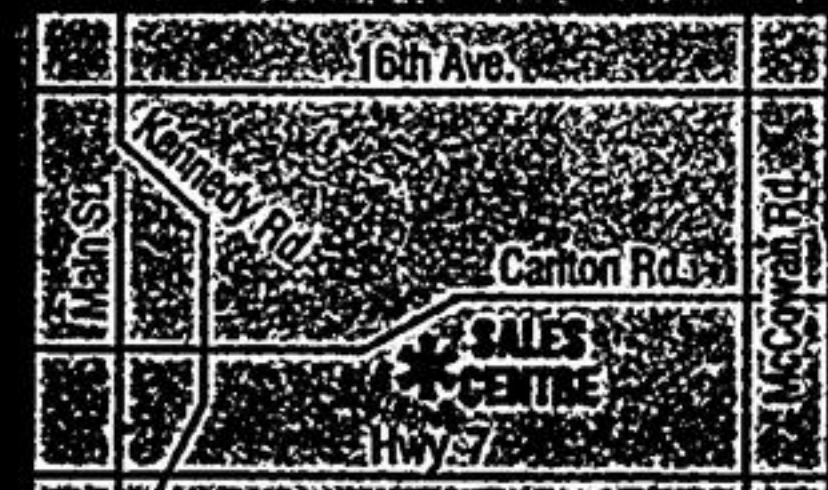
