An inside look at York Region golf courses

SILVER LAKES GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB

GOLF DIRECTOR: Ian Crebbin

SIGNATURE HOLE: Although playing out at 595 yards, No. 14 plays as more a test of accuracy than power, which is the case with most of this 7,029-yard Carolinas-style course.

Usually playing into the wind, double trouble looms on this par-5 test in the aqua range to the left and a well-treed out-of-bounds area, which extends all the way to a narrow, kidney-shaped green. For more fun, note the bunkers guarding both sides of the green. (It should be noted the bunkers at Silver Lakes have been upgraded to silicone sand. Looks great, plays great, but you'd rather admire it than be mired in it.)

Golf director Ian Crebbin suggests a long iron, middle wood and wedge to reach the green in regulation. "The key is to keep it in play because it is a three-shot hole," cautions Crebbin. "There's no percentage in playing for the yardage."

TROUBLE AWAITS: The key to No. 2 is the second shot. Golfers guilty of underestimating club-length on their approach shot on this 376-yard, par-4 hole will encounter the lake, which comes into play about 80 yards out, runs up the right wide and wraps about 20 yards behind the green.

Point to ponder as you walk up to the tee: the lake slurps up approximately 800 golf balls per week. Hmmm.

Off the tee, the preferred landing area is about 230 yards on right side of the tree-lined fairway, leaving another 150 yards to the green.

It's an intimidating hole if people allow it into their heads. "Negative thoughts usually produce negative shots," advises Crebbin.

Do yourself a favour and think pure thoughts for pure shots.

CURSE OF THE COURSE: With deep bush lining both sides of a narrow fairway, spraying the ball is courting disaster on the 450-yard, No. 12. Silver Lake's longest par-4 hole, which usually plays into the wind, demands two exceptional shots to reach the green in regulation. The well-bunkered rolling green is tough, especially on the heels of a long, tricky approach shot.

GIMME A LIFE MEMBERSHIP: Quite likely, the most scenic hole on a course carved right out of the bush, No. 4 is a sand wedge from the banks of the Holland River.

At 407 yards, this par-4 dogleg left requires a strategically placed low iron off the tee to navigate a tree and clear a pond which extends some 110 yards on the left side. Narrow, teeter-totter green is shouldered by bunkers and a series of mounds.

It's the favourite for most people because it's so picturesque, says Crebbin. "You're right on the Holland River and at any given time there's water planes and Seadoos running up the river."

CLUB-TOSSING TIME: No. 8: There are two options off the tee. The first requires a drive of better than 200 yards to clear a ball-hungry pond. The faint of heart may opt to play it safe and ball out to the left.

THE PRO'S VIEW: "The main thing here is to hit it straight because almost every hole is tree-lined," advises Crebbin.
