Residents urged to submit photos for special millennium book

What makes York Region special to you and your family?

Is it an historic site that holds significance for you? Is it a recreation area? Perhaps it's a special celebration or festival that your family attends every year. Maybe it's just the tourist-delighting scenery around Lake Simcoe, juxtaposed with the dramatic high-tech corridor in the south end. Maybe it's the faces of little children, who come with their families from all over the world to make York Region home.

York Region and the York Simcoe Community Development Corporation, with the assistance of *The Era-Banner*, *The Liberal*, *Markham Economist & Sun* and *Stouffville Tribune*, want to see your vision of the region in photographs and they'd like to share some of those photographs in a special hard-cover coffee table book being published as a millennium project in May 2000.

Help capture the spirit of York Region in pictures and words, make your submission to us and help celebrate a special community in a special year.

The book's goal is to portray our individual communities diversity, history and unique qualities, while demonstrating how they all work together in mutual causes, such as economic development, promotion and

community enhancement.

Plans are for the book, as yet unnamed, to cover all aspects of life — culture, business, education, youth, seniors, agriculture and the arts.

The book will have three sections: • First is a photojournalistic history of the region. It will be done by the professionals.

• The second section, the main content of the book, is everyone's section — you're all invited to make submissions of photos taken all over the region from all four seasons (Canada Day would be a perfect day to get started). We'll publish submission deadlines for each season, but if you have a spectacular winter photograph from last February, we'll certainly give it our consideration.

• The third section is a look at the future of York Region, as seen through the eyes of some invited contributors to the book.

The photos in the second section must be accompanied by a description of the photo content, outlining its significance to the community.

This gives each person in York Region the opportunity to participate in this millennium project and, through their eyes and camera, express what is the most important view of their life in the region. Each person, business or organization submitting an

entry will receive a certificate of acknowledgment.

Both published and unpublished photos will be assembled into travel and gallery exhibits which will tour the region and which will be used on the region's Internet site to describe the uniqueness of living in York Region and the benefits of living, working and vacationing here.

To get in the book, get out there and start shooting photos.
