Cabinet shuffle boosts profile of Thornhill MP

"I have over 20 years of experience in public life and every experience has been part of my career, but the last two years have been very different," explained Caplan in a telephone interview from Ottawa yesterday afternoon, a day after family and friends watched her sworn in at Rideau Hall. "I have learned how important this role is to the lives of Canadians and also on the world stage."

As a grandchild of immigrants, I realize how this country has prospered because of its enormous diversity.

"I'm hoping to bring a sense of fairness and compassion (to the ministry) because I understand the important role immigrants have played in this country. As a grandchild of immigrants, I realize how this country has prospered because of its enormous diversity."

"I have a desire to live in a country that has tolerance and peace," added Caplan, who spent yesterday in a day-long orientation session.

Caplan replaces Montreal MP Lucienne Robillard, who was shifted to the Treasury Board to fill the void of Marcel Masse, who's poor health forced him out of cabinet.

York Region's three other Liberal MPs were passed over by Chretien.

Vaughan-King-Aurora veteran MP Maurizio Bevilacqua and York North MP Karen Kraft-Sloan have yet to hold cabinet positions, while Oak Ridges MP Bryon Wilfert is midway through his rookie term in Ottawa.

Bevilacqua, the finance committee chairperson, said he is not disappointed with Chretien's

cabinet decisions. "I think it's the same in any profession, but particularly politics, that it's not really the position but what you do with it that matters the most," pointed out Bevilacqua, who believes Caplan's new position will help raise the profile of York Region.

Meanwhile, Caplan was one of five backbench MPs promoted to the cabinet, with five others dumped and several ministers shifted. Chretien said the moves represent a new team that will lead the Liberals into the next federal election.

And Caplan's promotion to the immigration ministry will keep her busy, as responsibilities will include an overhaul to the Immigration Act and changes to the immigration and refugee system. As well, she will oversee Bill C-63 that tightens criteria for obtaining citizenship and changes the citizenship oath.

She must also decide whether or not to scrap the \$975 head tax charged to all refugees and immigrants when they arrive in Canada.

"People forget that just a few years ago, this country was looking at a \$42-billion deficit. But with a lot of hard work by everyone, we have delivered two balanced budgets," Caplan said.

"We will look at things that are necessary, but also try to have the balance and diversity to have people come here and help build a prosperous Canada."

The entire cabinet and caucus of Liberal MPs will meet in Halifax for a three-day party retreat, beginning Aug. 17.
