Promoting dog safety

had previously attacked other dogs which would qualify it as vicious under the new bylaw, provided the attacks were made "without provocation."

Councillor Mark Carroll argued the bylaw's distinction between provoked and unprovoked attacks is important.

"If somebody is poking or tormenting a dog, sometimes they deserve to get bitten," he said.

Carroll and Scala will also sit, along with an animal control officer, on a committee to hear appeals from dog owners.

Council also agreed Tuesday to spend \$3,000 on a campaign to promote responsible dog ownership.

It was recommended that 10,000 educational brochures on the subject be printed.

They may be distributed through nursery schools, churches

or any place in the town with young children.

"If you know the facts on how a dog acts, you can avoid attacks," announces the Georgina-produced brochure, which uses cartoons to illustrate dogs may bite, for example, if disturbed while sleeping or eating. It also tells children not to run and not to stare if approached by a stray dog.

Scala also said Georgina Animal Control has a child's education program on the whys and why nots of handling dogs.

Dog or cat attacks on humans are not uncommon in York Region. Last year there were 679 biting incidents, investigated by the health department.

Only 109 of these biting or scratching attacks involved strays.

Recorded dog or cat attacks numbered 644 in 1997 and 577 the previous year.
