Bay played at the Junior B level in Northern Ontario last season.

The Spirit, who placed seventh in the 12-team Central Conference last year and were swept three straight in their first ever playoff series with the first-place Collingwood Blues, will be without their two leading scorers from the 1998-99 campaign. Kevin Edgar, who led the club with 86 points, is over age, while Phil Barski, who tallied 73 points, is to play with the Milton Merchants of the Western Conference.

Spirit general manager Dieter Schmidt admits there are some big holes to fill. But he suggested the newcomers would add a new dimension to the team.

"We're a bigger team, and we appear to be stronger."

The GM said the younger players might have a problem adjusting to the removal of the centre red line this season.

"We're young, and we were burned against Caledon (by break out passes crossing two lines)."

But Schmidt said he's confident the players will adapt.

"It's just going to take a while to get used to the new style of play."

Youth will also be the focus as the Spirit look to build upon a fan base that has been increasing steadily over the past few seasons. Spirit marketing director Jamie Hakonson said that since young people have accounted for a significant part of that growth, the club will actively court them.

"We'll have promotions that will be geared to minor hockey kids," she said. "We want to get the kids out."

The Spirit also hope to benefit at the gate by continuing the trend towards adding familiar local faces to the club executive. Popular Stouffville men's hockey league official and player Pat Madigan is the team's vice-president of operations. Former Stouffville Clipper and Uxbridge Brun Jamie Showers has been added as an assistant to Schmidt, while David Beauchamp is to assist Eldon Wagg as the club's administrator.

"Edi (Hakonson, the Spirit's principal owner) has spread the load," said Jamie Hakonson. "The addition of these people is going to help with the delegation of duties and it will help with the surface appearance of the club as well."

With the club set from an administrative standpoint, Madigan suggests it's now a matter of the new talent showing their potential on the ice.

"We have a lot of talent," said Madigan. "Our scouts did a great job. Everybody's pumped."
