Career Fair features more than 70 companies

Anyone with ambitions of climbing the career ladder will find something of interest at next week's career fair.

The event will be held Wednesday at the Sheraton Parkway Toronto North Hotel at Hwy. 7 and Leslie Street in Richmond Hill.

More than 70 companies and agencies — employment agencies, personnel consultants, training companies, educational representatives and human resource specialists — will be on hand for the day-long affair.

There will be plenty of information for people looking for a job, or to advance in their current job, said Nicole Mathieu, advertising director for the York Region division of Metroland newspapers and organizer of the event.

They can sign up for career training, learn about networking or even meet employment recruiters for some of this area's biggest companies.

The highlight of the fair is an address by networking specialist Donna Messer, president of ConnectUs Communications Canada.

Mathieu said this career fair is the result of the success of the first such event held in the spring at Seneca College in King.

Several thousand people attended that fair and we decided to stage a fall event at a larger venue to attract even more people.

Service agencies, including Community Care Access Centre of York Region, CHATS, Neighbourhood Employment Resource Centre, Job Skills and Comprehensive Rehabilitation and Mental Health Services, are also attending.


