Perseverance and hard work pay off for Co-op

A Stouffville company is in the black. Less than five years ago, the future of the Stouffville Co-op was uncertain. But perseverance and hard work paid off. The Edward Street co-op has just posted a \$335,000 annual profit.

The 56-year-old co-operative held its annual meeting last week. There, the board of directors presented the final financial statement, showing the co-operative posted \$8.6 million in sales and service revenue last year.

The Stouffville Co-op is owned by 3,000 people and the company is a shareholder of GROWMARK Inc.

Profits were so good at the Edward Street industry that the company was able to turn over \$35,000 to its members this year, said company manager Doug Watson.

"We've had two good years back to back," Watson said. "I attribute the success to the people who work here. Our staff is hard working. They make this company," Watson said.

The Stouffville Co-op provides feed, agronomy products and services, consumer products and services and petroleum to York and Durham regions.

For the 25 employees at the Stouffville Co-op, job security is not an issue. "We're doing very well. We're here for a long time," Watson said.
