Fall food drive

The York Region Daily Bread Food Bank fall co-operative food drive begins Tuesday and runs to Sunday, Oct. 17.

During the past six months, almost 25,000 emergency meal packages were handed out by regional food banks — half of them to children who would otherwise have gone hungry.

With added winter expenses, more families will need to turn to a food bank.

Donations of non-perishable foods can be dropped off at area fire stations, Loblaws stores and Supercenters. Food banks cannot accept donations from bulk-food outlets.

Seat belt safety

Seatbelts on four of every five children checked are not properly applied, according to York Region Health Services.

Of 296 car seats checked over one year by health nurses in the region, 15 were installed properly.

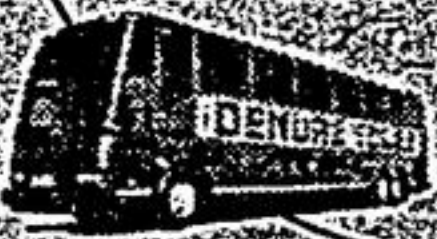
