

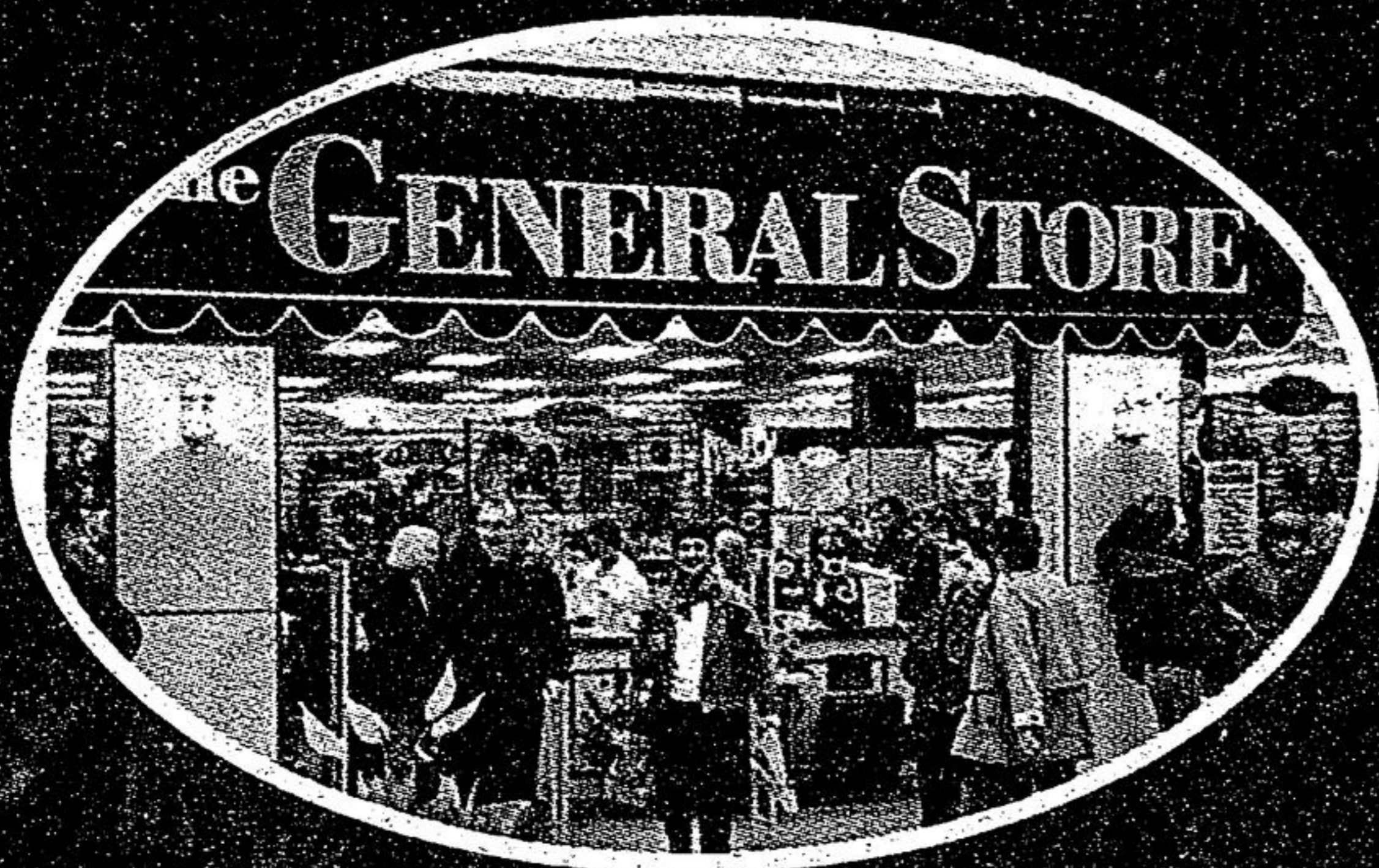

Man responsible for five heists

One man is responsible for five bank robberies in the past five months, according to police.

York Regional Police say the suspect, who is considered armed and dangerous, robbed two of the banks twice.

The bandit conceals a holdup note in a newspaper or black binder, then gives it to the bank teller.

He always says he has a gun and, on two occasions, he has opened his suit coat to reveal a handgun inside a shoulder holster. No shots have ever been fired and no one has been injured.

Once he has the money, the robber runs out of the bank and gets into the passenger side of a small pickup truck.

Police believe the man was responsible for the following robberies:

- June 10 at 3:24 p.m. — CIBC, 8099 Keele St., Vaughan;
- July 23 at 12:15 p.m. — CIBC, 10037 Keele St., Vaughan;
- Aug. 25 at 10:40 a.m. — Scotiabank, 625 Cochrane Dr., Markham;
- Sept. 28 at 11:53 p.m. — CIBC, 10037 Keele St., Markham; and,
- Oct. 13 at 10:33 a.m. — Scotiabank,

625 Cochrane Dr., Markham. The suspect is described as white, five feet 11 inches, with an average build, black hair and glasses. He is known to wear a dark suit.

The truck is described as a small, dark pickup truck similar to a Ford Ranger.

Schwab was rushed to York Central Hospital, where he died.

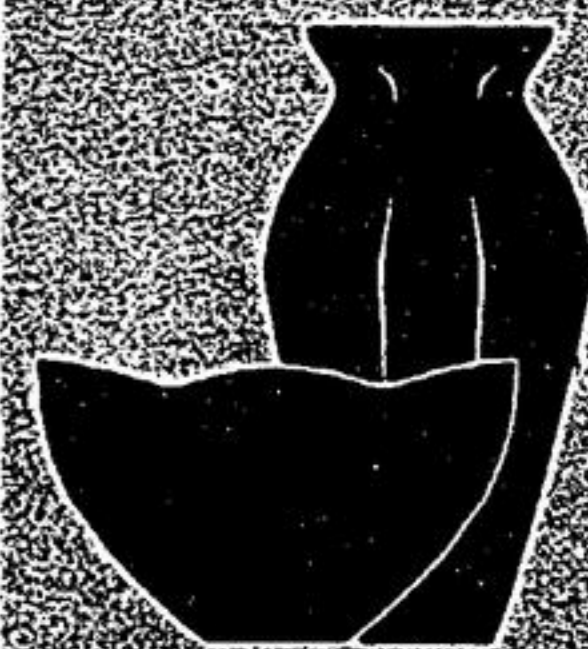

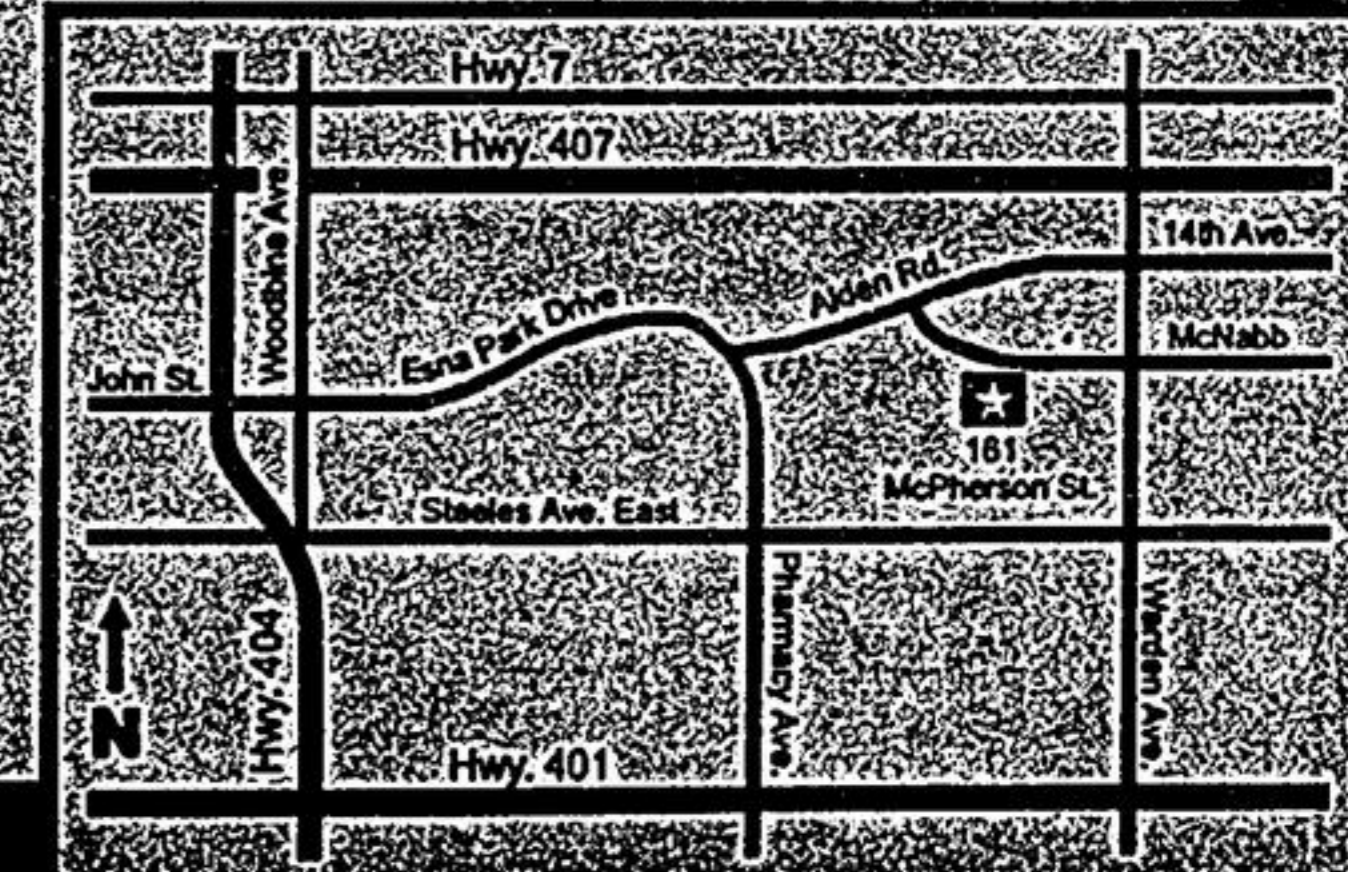

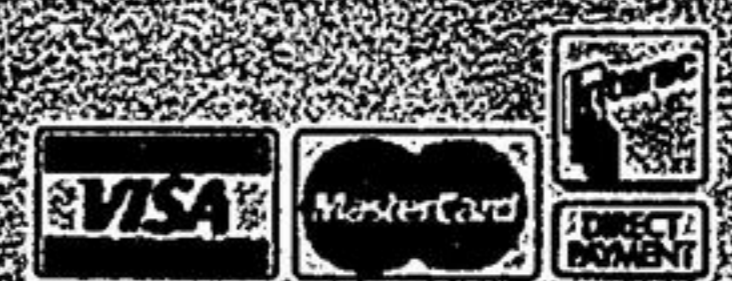
