

# Local men linked to burglaries

Two Stouffville men are facing criminal charges in two separate robberies.

A 21-year-old Main Street man was arrested after a number of garages were broken into during the evening of Nov. 9.

"A quantity of property was received, which the officers have not been able to identify," said York Regional Police Sgt. John Sheldon.

The articles include tools, electrical cords and a folding table.

"The investigators feel the accused may have entered other garages in Stouffville in the vicinity of Rupert Avenue, Main Street and the Ninth Line," Sheldon said.

The man faces charges of break and

enter and theft, theft under \$5,000 and mischief under \$5,000.

He's scheduled to appear in Newmarket court Dec. 13.

Another Stouffville man was arrested in connection with a break-in in Uxbridge and the discovery of goods stolen in Huntsville.

A 35-year-old Stouffville man was arrested at his home.

Police said tools were removed from a construction site on Sangster Road in Uxbridge as well as from a construction site in Huntsville.

The man faces charges of break enter and theft, possession of stolen property, mischief to property, breach of recognizance and possession of a controlled substance.





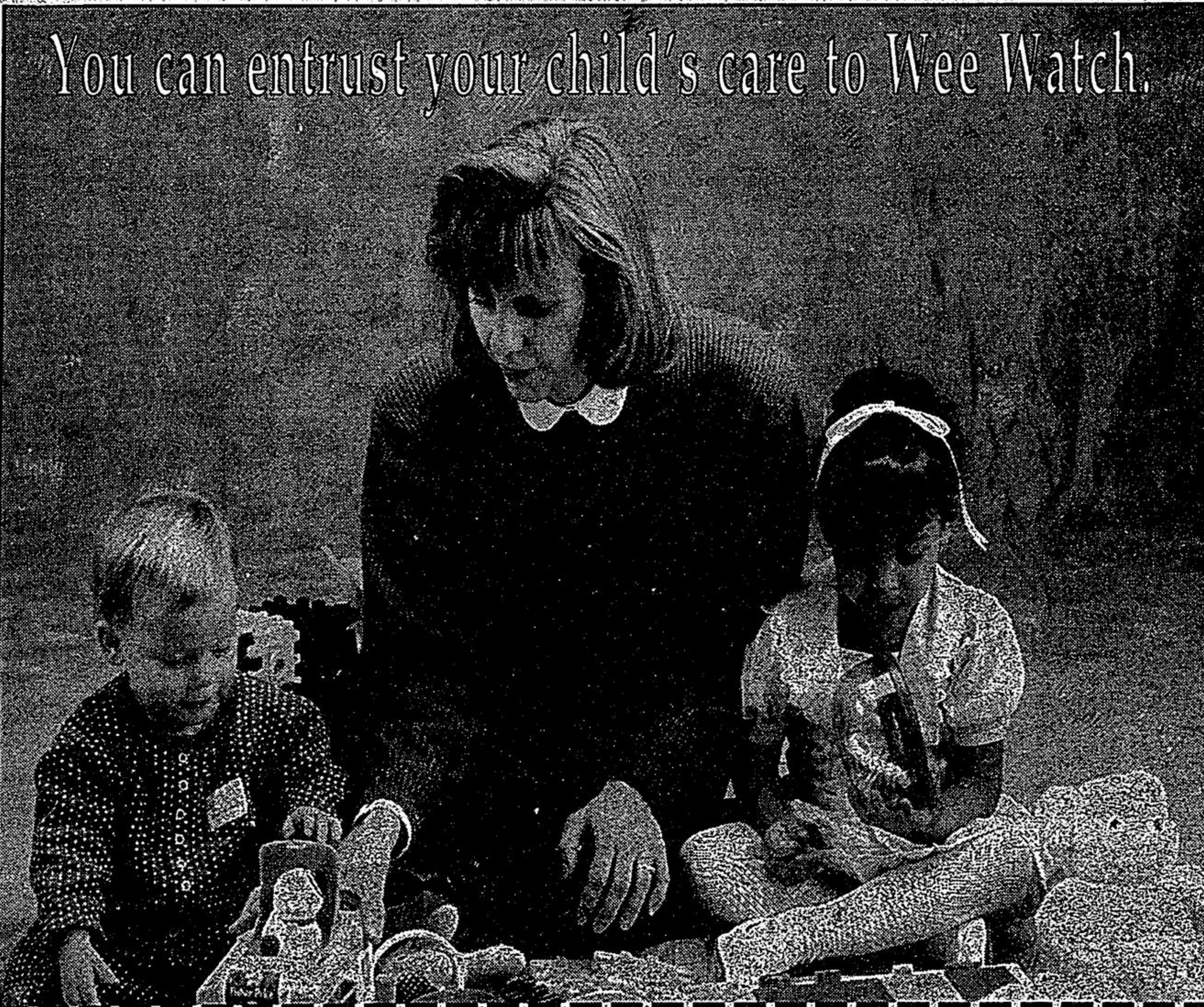
