## Toronto backs development freeze

Your moraine is our moraine too, politicians from Toronto told York Region last week.

Toronto City Council voted to back a temporary development freeze along the Oak Ridges Moraine. It also decided Toronto will go to watch, and may get involved, as Richmond Hill and Uxbridge host Ontario Municipal Board hearings on moraine housing.

Toronto cares about what happens in Richmond Hill because moraine groundwater runs down into the city's rivers, say councillors who sponsored the motions.

"We don't want to be left out anymore," Councillor John Adams (Midtown) said in an interview.

"Welcome to Greater Toronto - we're all connected." Most delegates at the recent Clean Waters Summit in Markham supported a freeze, although Tony Clement, provincial minister responsible for the moraine, ruled it out.

The summit was led by David Crombie, a former Toronto mayor who has long stressed the connection between a healthy moraine and the city's waterfront.

"What people are really starting to think is, hey, my water comes from up there," said Mike Colle, a Toronto Liberal MPP (Eglinton-Lawrence) whose private member's bill aims at freezing development on the moraine until a powerful planning body is set up to oversee it.

Last month, the countryside and environment committee of the Greater Toronto Services Board also backed a six-month freeze.

At a separate meeting of area mayors last week, however, York Region mayors and regional chairperson Bill Fisch opposed a freeze. The issue may be decided tomorrow, when the GTSB meets at Toronto's Black Creek Pioneer Village.

Toronto Councillor Joan King (Seneca Heights), chairperson of the GTSB committee, said the city made mistakes with its waterways and doesn't want to see them repeated up on the moraine.

Toronto can be an ally for regions like York in getting the province to act, she said.

Getting such co-operation will not be easy. Colle has attacked what he called a developers' "gold rush" on the moraine, and fellow Liberal MPPs have charged Clement intervened in a housing application in Uxbridge because he was influenced by the developer's contributions to the Tory party.

Although Fisch and mayors like Richmond Hill's Bill Bell rejected a freeze, Colle suggested they were being pressured by powerful developers who have given them campaign donations.

"How many hundreds of thousands of dollars have these developers given those politicians?" he asked.

"That money talks," Colle added, although he stressed development firms are legitimate businesses with a right to protect their interests. "It's pretty hard for anybody to stand up to that kind of pressure."

In York, Colle maintained, "it's going to take brave councillors" and a "brave mayor" to stand up to developers and the boosts to tax assessment development brings.
