From page 14... agent... "When Sean came to the Spirit he told them I was available. They invited me to come out and play a couple of exhibition games, and then they signed me. Eliopoulos says the Spirit have shown a winning chemistry from the beginning of the season. "The team seemed to fit together right from the start." Despite a recent mini-slump that saw the Spirit lose three games in a row, Eliopoulos feels the team will be ready for the playoffs next month. "We know we have the talent to play with any team in our (North) conference. And I think we understand that the whole season boils down to how you do in the playoffs. He said an added incentive is that the playoffs are the best time to be seen by scouts from OHL and university hockey teams. Looking ahead, Eliopoulos says he'll make a decision after the season ends as to whether to try again to make it in the OHL, or pursue a hockey scholarship with an American university. He's already been approached by schools including Colgate University. While his dreams include playing in the National Hockey League one day, he realizes the

odds are against such an eventuality. So he'll continue to play at the highest level possible until he can no longer hold his own. "As long as I can still compete I'll be out there." Spirit struggling The Spirit of Stouffville suffered its fifth loss in its last six outings on Saturday when it dropped a 7-5 road decision to the seventh-place Parry Sound Shamrocks. The Spirit trailed 2-1 after one period, but battled back to knot the count at 3-3 through two. After both clubs exchanged goals by the midway point of the final period, the Shamrocks delivered three unanswered goals to take a 7-4 lead. Doug Orr delivered two goals for the Spirit, now 23-21-2-0 on the season. Jesse Johnston, J.D. Smithson and Michel Bond, on a power play, added singles. The Spirit were just one of seven on the power play. The loss enabled the Huntsville Wildcats to move within two points of the fifth-place Spirit. The Spirit will host the Collingwood Blues on Thursday and then travel to Markham on Friday for a game with the Waxers. The Spirit will then conclude its regular season schedule Sunday on the road against the Newmarket Hurricanes at 7:30 p.m.

From page 14... opment of players and coaches. And anything that can enhance that has to be looked at as positive. He said any agreement to join forces would require the approval of both executive boards, as well as that of the memberships of both associations through a vote. It would also need to be ratified by the Ontario Minor Hockey Association and may require Ontario Hockey Federation approval. While the WSMHA rep players would appear to favour a merger with the Waxers, Cartwright said the idea has encountered some opposition among coaches and parents. Some fear that by letting Stouffville youngsters play in Markham there could be a weakening of Stouffville rep teams. He says while that is a possibility, it would be offset by the greater opportunities available to the Stouffville players. "From an executive standpoint, while you want to have the strongest

teams possible, you also want to create the best opportunities possible for the kids." He said a WSMHA committee is currently considering the form the merger would take. The executive has reserved the right to view the final details of any agreement before giving its blessing. "A general membership meeting is to be held in late February if we are making progress," said Cartwright. "Ideally, it could be in place for next season, as long as the membership agrees." He said there is the possibility the merger could be introduced in phases, beginning with the transfer of the WSMHA's AAA affiliation to the Waxers for the 2000-2001 season. Bill Jefferson, Markham Minor Hockey Association president, noted the talks between the two organizations are not new. "We've been working on this for quite a while, for close to 10 years," he said. "It's a natural mix for Markham and Stouffville. We seem to do everything else together," he reasoned.

Stouffville runner Fred Robbins gave a good account of himself at the recent 33rd annual Hartshorne Memorial mile at Cornell University. The 45-year-old Robbins finished seventh in the elite division race with a time of 4:48.72.
