404 shooting not road rage: police

York Regional Police doubt a drive-by shooting on Hwy. 404 last week was either a car jacking or a road rage incident.
 But investigators still don't have a motive in the shooting that had two Toronto men fearing for their lives.
 Det. Graham Beverly of the hold-up squad said police initially believed the shooting near Hwy. 7 was a botched car jacking.
 But that was quickly ruled out after police spoke with the pair who were inside the Chevy Tahoe.


Police have seized "property" they believe may be linked to the shooting from the vehicle.
 Meanwhile, police are attempting to match a handgun found near the Don Valley Parkway to bullets found in the vehicle.
 The truck was travelling south on Hwy. 404 near Hwy. 7 at about 10 p.m. when a grey, mid-sized car pulled alongside it.
 At least one gunman inside the car blasted shots at the 4x4, taking out three tires and shattering three windows.

able distance up and down Hwy. 48 and then west along Elgin Mills Road, Sheldon said.
 While following the Pontiac, the resident used a cellular phone to keep police updated on the suspect's whereabouts.
 "The citizen finally lost sight of the suspect vehicle as he was sure he knew he was being followed," Sheldon said.
 Soon after the citizen gave up the chase, the Pontiac was spotted by Const. Enoch Fung, 33.
 "I saw the car. I had a hunch," said Fung, a two-year member of the force. "It matched the description. It was going at a high rate of speed. I tried to

stop him. He took off."
 Finally, the driver of the Pontiac abandoned the car in Richmond Hill, took off on foot and the chase continued.
 Fung ran after the six-foot, three-inch, 220-pound con. With the help of the canine patrol and the armed tactical unit, the suspect was cornered.
 Chappelle didn't pose any further problems once he was apprehended. "The suspect was cooperative," Fung said. "No one was injured."
 Chappelle has been charged with three counts of break and enter, break and enter with intent, possession of stolen property over \$5,000, possession of stolen property under \$5,000 and dangerous operation of a motor vehicle.


