THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK STOPPING UP AND CLOSING OF A PORTION OF WOODBINE AVENUE (Y.R. 8), TOWN OF MARKHAM

THE COUNCIL OF THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK
PROPOSES TO PASS A BY-LAW AUTHORIZING:

1. The stopping up and closing of that part of Woodbine Avenue (Y.R. 8), in the Town of Markham, in The Regional Municipality of York being part of Lot 18, Concession 3, designated as Parts 29 and 45 on Plan 65R-20885.
2. The conveyance of the above-noted lands to the owner of the adjacent lands.

Pursuant to Section 300 of the *Municipal Act*, the Transportation and Works Committee of the Regional Council will, at its meeting to be held at 9:00 a.m. on the 1st day of March, 2000 in Committee Room "A" at the Regional Administrative Building located at 17250 Yonge Street, Newmarket, hear any person who claims that his/her lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard.
