Nine town-owned condos to be sold with council approval

Nine town-owned condominium units will be sold if Whitchurch-Stouffville council agrees to a recommendation.
 Today, council is expected to agree to the sale of nine units at 86 Ringwood Dr.
 The town acquired the property in 1999.
 "They reverted back to the town through unpaid taxes," Mayor Wayne Emmerson explained.
 There is an indication that the real estate market has improved since last year and recently there has been interest expressed in the purchase of some of the units, staff has reported.

If council agrees to the sale, an appraisal will be undertaken to determine the fair market value of the properties.

In addition, the local real estate businesses will be provided with an open listing for the properties and will be asked to submit any offers to purchase to the director of community and leisure services.

Winery outlined to council

A winery will be built in Stouffville if council gives the nod.
 Today, Stouffville resident Mario Testa is expected to outline a plan to build Willow Springs winery at 5572 Bethesda Rd.
 Testa plans to sell grapes and fruit wines along with related merchandise such as corkscrews.
 He's applied to the town for an amendment to

the existing zoning.
 Town staff points out that the winery will measure 2,800 square feet.
 The plans include a retail store and an office. The rest of the space will be used for manufacturing.
 The 15-acre parcel of land is now zoned rural and will remain so. The proposed amendment will permit an on-site wine store for the sale of wines produced on the property.
