## Runners burn up the track at two indoor events

Members of the Stouffville track club made their presence felt at the recent Ontario Minor Track Association provincial indoor championships at York University.

A total of 13 members took to the track and brought home one gold, one silver and two bronze medals.

Daniel DeCouvreur led the Stouffville entry, by capturing the race walk event with a time of 5:57.99.

Kirsten Scheliga ran a smart race and came from behind to finish second in the 800m in a time of 2:46.78.

Jeff Kavluk ran off with a bronze medal in the 1,500m in a time of 6:41.46.

Jeff's sister, Kimberley, ran in the atom girls' 1,500m and finished seventh in a time of 6:42.00.

Stephan DeCouvreur ran in the atom boys' event and finished sixth in 5:39.49.

In the atom girls' 400m heats, Scheliga finished second in 1:09.25 while Kavluk was eighth.

In the atom boys' field, Stephan DeCouvreur was seventh while his brother, Daniel, was ninth.

The senior girls saw Dana Wood entered in a tough field but finish her race in 66.41.

Devon Ketcheson ran in the senior

boys' event and finished with a personal best time of 61.3.

In the 200m, Jillian Scheliga ran a personal best time in the tyke girls' field at 37.66.

Craig Thomas tied his personal best time of 33.92 in the tyke field.

Deirdre Wood ran a strong second half to finish sixth.

Rachel Coles made her debut in the atom girls' race and finished with a time of 39.37.

In the 60m event, Andrew Crawford was sixth in his heat and 12th overall in the tyke boys' division.

Also entered in the 60m hurdles, he finished fifth in his heat and ninth overall.

Wood finished third in the atom girls' field in a time of 9.00.

In the senior girls' division, Jasmine Geens won her heat in a time of 8:1 and finished fourth in a semi-final.

In relay events, the atom girls' team of Kirsten Scheliga, Jillian Scheliga, Coles and Wood finished fourth in the 4 x 200m event with a time of 2:20.95.
