Pallotta notes 71 teams consisting of the top 40 from the two-day regional bass qualifiers, 20 from the one-day tour bass qualifiers, 10 from the BM 100's and last year's defending Classic champ will qualify for this year's title.

Spartans serve up berth in YRAA final

The Stouffville District Secondary School Spartans junior girls' volleyball team will be looking to spike gold today in Vaughan.

The Spartans were to contest the York Region Athletic Association AAA championship final against Newmarket H.S. at Vaughan's Westmount C.I.

The Spartans will be out to avenge a 25-9, 25-23 sweep at the hands of Newmarket in Tuesday's playoff pool tournament played at the Newmarket school.

It was the Spartans only defeat of the day as they prevailed over Alexander Mackenzie Secondary School 25-17, 25-8, Toronto District Christian School 25-14, 25-17, and Unionville High School 25-21, 25-23 to place second in the competition.

"The kids did really well. They all rose to the occasion," said Spartans coach Sharon MacFarlane.

For the Spartans, who finished second to Unionville in the southeast division standings, Tuesday marked the first time they've managed to defeat the first-place finishers all season. They'll be looking to perform a similar feat today against two-time YRAA champion Newmarket.

"Newmarket will certainly be favoured," MacFarlane conceded. "They're a solid team. But I think that 25-23 game against them Tuesday proved we can play with them."

MacFarlane said the Spartans' success has been due to a good mix of players.

She pointed to the play of front line players Joanne Crymble, Hannah Flemming, Andrea Meyer, Sandra Giles and Abi Barnett as being outstanding all season long.

Sandra Winstanley, Lindsay Hermanson and Sandra Metcalfe have also stood out, helping fill the void left by an ankle injury to Megan Crowder earlier in the season.

Meanwhile, the Spartans senior girls' volleyball team was to take to the SDSS court in pursuit of a ticket to the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Association AA championship tournament this afternoon.

The Spartans were to engage in a three-team round-robin against Sutton D.H.S. and the winner of the Durham Region final.


The winner will contest the OFSAA finals March 8-9 in Ottawa.

The Spartans, who placed third in the southeast division standings, knocked off second-place Markham D.H.S. in two straight games in last week's YRAA cross over playoff opener.

But they were swept in three matches at Tuesday's eight-team AAA playoff pool tournament in Unionville.

While SDSS is rated a AA rated school because of its low student population, all teams get to contend for the AAA crown this season.

Today's match up with Sutton will mark the first time the two traditional rivals have squared off this season.
