Japanese team in town

It's official. Stouffville's Recreation Complex will be the site of an exhibition hockey game involving two of the world's top women's national hockey teams April 1. The Japanese women's national team is to face off against the United States in the 7 p.m. contest.

The Japanese team has confirmed it will use the rec centre as its training base in preparation for the Women's World Hockey Championships, to be held in Mississauga from April 3 to 9.

The game with the Americans is one of several to be played by the Japanese squad during its 10-day camp.

"They're going to play in Pickering against the Durham Senior AAA team March 29, and we're hoping there will be another game at the rec centre against a senior women's team March 30," said Dianne White, president of the Stouffville-Markham Girls Hockey Association.

The SMGHA is to act as host to the Japanese team, which is to be put up at the Maples of Ballantrae hotel.

"We're very excited," said White. "I've sent letters out to all the girls (in the SMGHA)."

The Japanese women are to train at the rec centre from March 24 until April 3 to familiarize themselves with the local environment prior to the world tournament.

White said her association is seeking volunteers

to help out during the Japanese team's Stouffville stay. Corporate sponsors are also being asked to step forward.

Tickets for the April 1 game will go on sale closer to the actual date, said White.
