You are invited to attend a Public Information Meeting to be held by the Town of Markham, Development Services Commission, concerning a recently completed study regarding the Town's employment lands.

In January, 1999, Council retained Hemson Consulting Ltd. to examine Markham's supply of employment lands and determine its suitability to meet the Town's employment and economic development objectives. The Consultants were also asked to identify any additional employment land needs to accommodate forecasted employment growth to the year 2021, and to recommend possible Official Plan policy changes to ensure Town employment objectives could be met.

The consultants will present the key findings and recommendations of the Employment Lands Strategy Study at the Public Information Meeting. The Town would like to receive comments regarding the findings and recommendations of the study before any final decisions regarding implementation are made by Council. The information meeting is intended to allow you to discuss the findings of the study and to present your thoughts to the Consultants, Members of Council, Town staff and other members of the community.

Copies of the Employment Lands Strategy Study, prepared by the consultants, will be available for viewing or purchase after March 14, 2000 from the Development Services Commission at the address noted above. 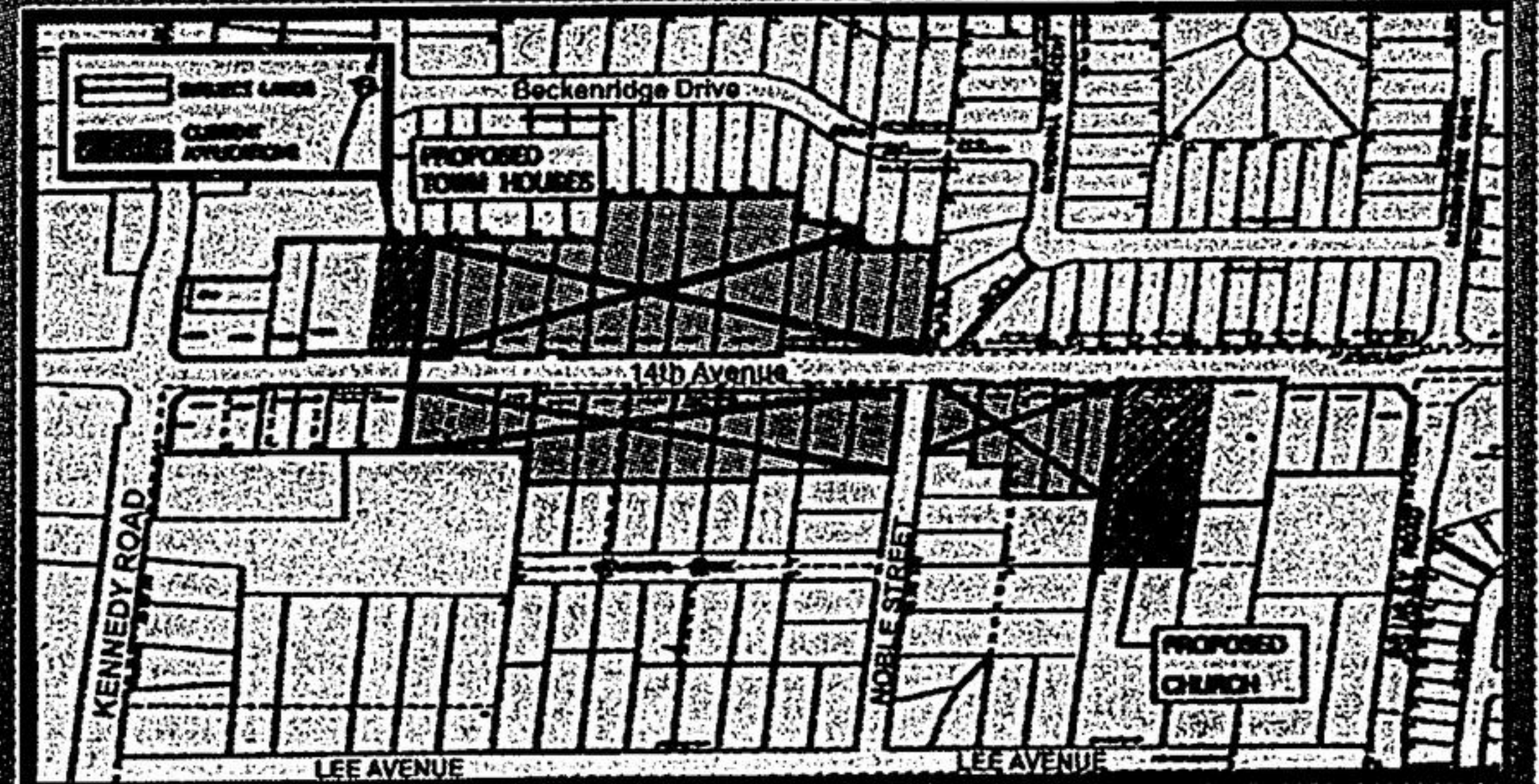

BACKGROUND

The 14th Avenue Land Use Study was initiated in the spring of 1998, to examine development applications and land use options along 14th Avenue between Kennedy Road and Brimley Road. Following two community information meetings, the scope of the study was narrowed to the two "nodes" at either end of the study area (see map). A further information meeting was held in June 1999 to receive public input on the consultant's draft final report.

PROPOSAL

The consultant has now completed his final report and recommends limited redevelopment in the "node" areas shown on the map, and maintaining the remainder of the area for "Low Density Residential" uses. Urban design guidelines and suggested Official Plan policies are also included in the consultant's recommendations. The consultant's recommendations, if endorsed by the Development Services Committee and Council, would be implemented through a future amendment to the Official Plan. Such an Official Plan amendment would provide for a limited amount of redevelopment, through future site specific rezoning applications, at the Kennedy/14th node and the Brimley/14th node. An additional Public Meeting will be held, should the Committee wish to consider such an Official Plan amendment.

If you wish to be notified of the Public Meeting to consider the adoption of a future official plan amendment (if any), you must make a written request to the Clerk of the Town of Markham at the address noted above.
