Tindale Road Reconstruction:

This work consists of the supply of all material, labour and equipment to reconstruct Tindale Road from Park Drive to Manitoba Street including storm sewers, watermain replacement, sanitary sewer repair, base restoration, subdrain, granular materials, concrete curb and gutter and hot mix asphalt.

Albert Street Reconstruction:

This work consists of the supply of all material, labour and equipment to reconstruct Albert Street from Second Street to Harold Avenue including storm sewer, watermain replacement, base restoration, subdrain, granular materials and hot mix asphalt.

WATER DISTRIBUTION FLUSHING PROGRAM

The Public Works Department will be conducting a watermain flushing program throughout the Community of Stouffville, commencing Tuesday, May 23rd, 2000. This work will be conducted between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. and is expected to last until approximately Wednesday, May 31st, 2000.

COMMUNITIES OF BALLANTRAE & MUSSELMAN LAKE

The Public Works Department reminds residents that it is conducting routine flushing operations of the Ballantrae/Musselman Lake municipal water distribution system.

The next flushing of the system is scheduled to resume on Tuesday, May 23rd, 2000 and will be conducted between the hours of 9:00 a.m. & 3:30 p.m. and will be repeated every two (2) weeks until further notice.

This flushing is necessary to simulate normal operation of the system.

During the flushing operation discolouration of the water may occur and because of this we ask for your assistance by restricting the use of water to a minimum while the work is being conducted. Should discolouration of the water occur after the work has been completed let water run until it clears.

Questions and concerns regarding this operation should be directed to the Public Works Department.
