

Town wins award

The Town of Markham has won an industry award for the best internet application dubbed Explore Markham - Investor Tool.

The site allows potential investors to access the town's extensive real estate and economic databases.

The Urban and Regional Information Systems Association (URISA) chose Markham's entry over 12 others from across Canada, submitted by all levels of government and private industry.

"This is an invaluable tool for attracting new business to Markham," said Mayor Don Cousens. "With just a few

clicks of a mouse, you can search through extensive data, access aerial photographs and display the results in map form — an effort that not long ago would have taken weeks of work and contact with municipal departments to accomplish."

But club officials were recent-

ly told their Main Street meeting place is no longer available, putting the private club into an emergency situation.

"We're been forced to vacate.

So, we're seeking a donated space," said Eileen Ford, mother of a 27-year-old club member. "Going to the club means the world to the members. Without it, they'd sit at home alone. We're

doing everything we can to keep it going."

A small room in a church, plaza or private dwelling would fit the bill. "We have our own furniture. All we need is the room," said Ford.
