throats, runny eyes, nosebleeds and dizziness because of the mould.
 "The Attorney General of Ontario (Jim Flaherty) has known for months about an environmental disaster on his watch. He has done nothing about it," Bryant said.
 Judges are being forced to decide on a daily basis whether to hear cases after assessing their own health and that of lawyers, prisoners, courthouse employees and the public in their courtrooms.

"The judges shouldn't have to play environmental inspectors," Bryant said.
 "The A.G. (Attorney General) must close down this toxic hazard and make immediate alternative arrangements. We have sick employees, case backlog and trial delays. Yet, again, this government is in contempt of our courts, the victims who appear before them and the workers who keep them up and running."
 But Crawley said all the mould is being removed according to Ministry of Labour orders.
 He said no court cases have been delayed, although one criminal trial has been transferred to the Barrie courthouse.

"We have responded to all of the Ministry of Labour's orders," Crawley added.
 "The Ministry of Labour is monitoring this situation. I'm sure if the Ministry of Labour felt this building should be closed down, they would say that. They would issue a stop work order."

"I understand you're doing the best you can, but health concerns are escalating. We need to be out of here."

But Bob DeMatteo, senior health and safety officer for OPSEU, the union representing the majority of courthouse workers, doesn't trust the province has employees' best interests at heart.
 "The courthouse needs to be closed now. No one should have to work in an environment that is making them sick."
 Meanwhile, OPSEU steward Val Erwin said Ministry of Labour investigators shut down the criminal court office on the second floor late Friday afternoon due to mould and were considering other closures.
 At an information meeting for employees at the courthouse Friday morning, several worried workers also demanded the building be closed and court operations temporarily relocated until the mould is removed.

"These people are working in an environment that is dangerous," a court officer said.
 "I think you should close the place down."
 She wasn't pacified by environmental engineers' assurances that levels of mould are far less than those considered necessary to evacuate a building.
 "We don't want to hear no scientific mumbo jumbo."
 Other employees packed into the room agreed.
 "I understand you're doing the best you can, but health concerns are escalating. We need to be out of here," one woman said.

Workers complained they have been worried about air quality in the courthouse for years, adding the piecemeal cleanup of the mould means problems could resurface in the future.

Provincial officials agreed communication with staff since the mould was detected has been inadequate, and urged the workers to come forward with sightings of mould or health concerns.

Although Attorney General officials have known about the mould since March and the Ministry of Labour has been investigating since April, Bryant credited The Era-Banner for breaking the story June 1.

"Thank goodness you broke the story so the government was sufficiently embarrassed to deal with the situation."
