Road named after pioneer family

A portion of the 10th Line is expected to be renamed in honour of a local pioneer family.

At a meeting this Tuesday, Whitchurch-Stouffville council is expected to give the nod to rename a three-mile section of 10th Line, south of Main Street, Reesor Road, as a community millennium project.

The name change was initiated by the Whitchurch-Stouffville Museum.

Stouffville was founded by Abraham Stouffer and his wife, Elizabeth Reesor.

The Reesor family is holding its 10th family reunion at the Markham Fairgrounds tomorrow. More than 1,000 Reesors are expected to attend.

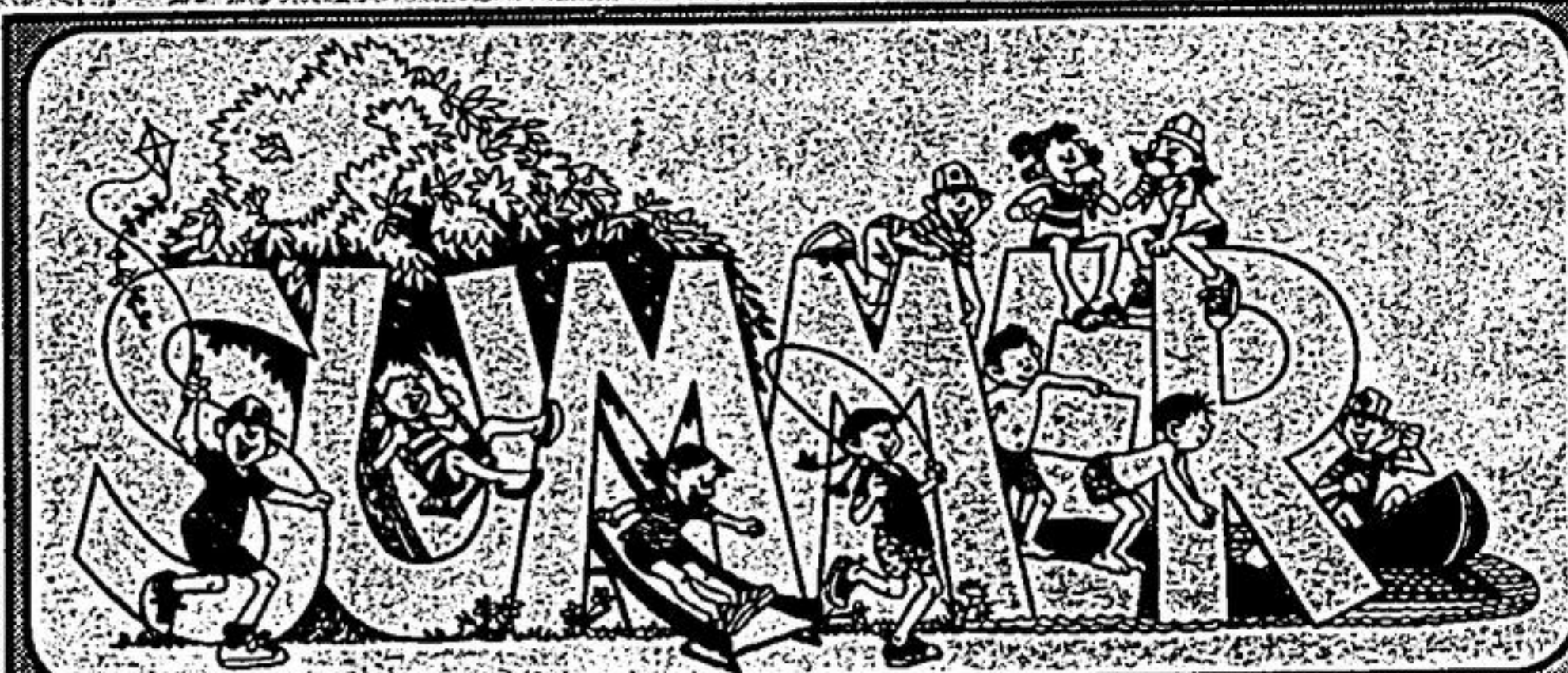

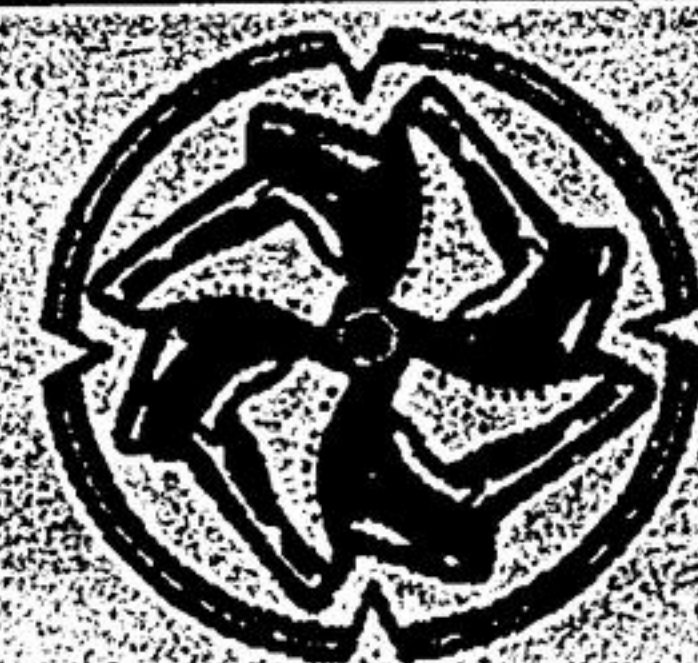
