Writers garner awards

Police reporter Kathleen Griffin was honoured by York Regional Police last week for writing the best print story of 1999. The story, 'Grieving for Childhood' chronicled sexual abuse.



The story of a woman recovering from childhood sexual abuse, written by reporter Kathleen Griffin of the Markham Economist and Sun and the Stouffville Tribune was the best in print in 1999; the York Regional Police announced last week.

'Grieving for Childhood', published last August, won Griffin Best Print Story honours for the second year in a row in the department's annual media awards.

A three-year police beat reporter for the Economist and the Tribune, Griffin also won the print category in 1998 with a feature warning of the dangers of replica guns.

Also this month, our columnist Joan Ransberry and The Liberal, our sister publication within the York Region division of Metroland Printing and Publishing, were named as award finalists in the Canadian Community Newspapers Association's annual Better Newspapers Competition.

Ransberry, who also reports on Whitchurch-Stouffville and rural affairs for Metroland's York Region group of newspapers, has won two previous CCNA awards. She was named one of three finalists for the Outstanding Columnist category on the strength of three consecutive weekly columns in 1999.

The CCNA named The Liberal newspaper for Vaughan, Richmond Hill and Thornhill area, a finalist in its Best All-Round Newspaper (circulation 25,000 and over), Best Front Page and Best Editorial Page categories.

A Liberal staff writer and education reporter for the York Region group of newspapers, Gianni Colavecchia, was named a finalist in the Best News Story and Best National Editorial categories.

In both cases, Colavecchia was nominated for his work at a previous employer, the Metroland newspaper, Lindsay This Week.

Rick Vanderlinde, the news editor for the Markham Economist and Sun and the Stouffville Tribune is also a finalist in the Best News Story category for a report on a natural gas explosion in Keswick. Vanderlinde wrote the story while working as a police reporter at The Newmarket Era-Banner.

The CCNA awards will be announced at the association's national convention in Magog, Que. next month.

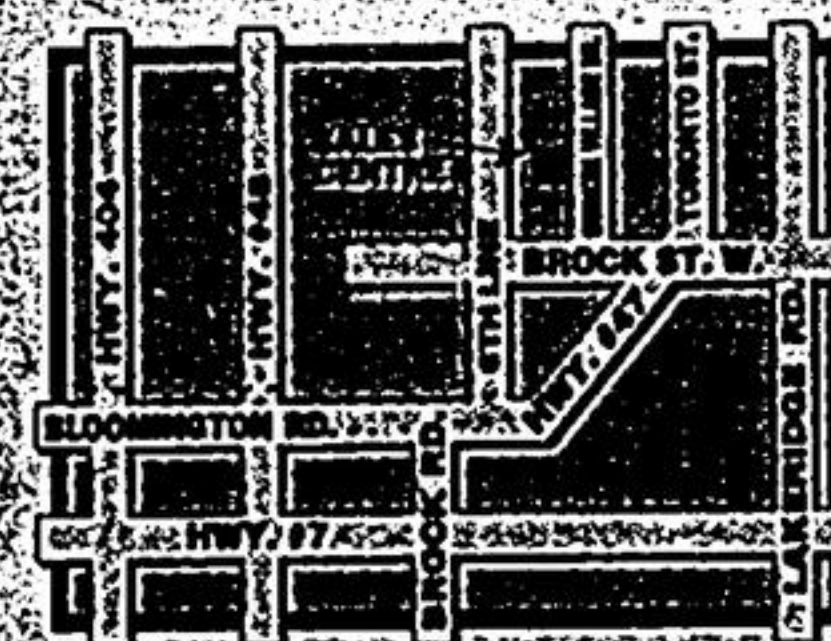
