The Canadian Cancer Society is a national, community-based organization of volunteers "whose mission is the eradication of cancer, and the enhancement of the quality of life of people living with cancer and their families", as well as risk prevention programs, Reynolds pointed out.

All eyes will soon be on a Stouffville home under construction.

When completed, the 5,000-square-foot house, located in Trail of the Wood, near Kennedy Road and Aurora Sideroad, will be a designer showcase to be used as a fundraiser.

The Canadian Cancer Society is, once again, working on its designer showcase fundraising event. This marks the first time the showcase home event will be in Stouffville. The fundraiser is being organized by the Markham-Whitchurch-Stouffville and Holland River Unit of the Cancer Society.

The new estate home is being offered for tours is built by the Beswick Group. It will be open to the public from late October to early December.

For six days a week on six consecutive weeks, the public will be invited to walk through the completely decorated and furnished house.

The goal for the project is \$65,000, said Joanne Reynolds, unit manager for the Canadian Cancer Society.

Between 5,000 and 10,000 people are expected to tour the elaborate home.
