NEW RULES FOR ELECTION SIGNS

The Council of the Town of Markham approved new rules for election signs. The changes provide for

- a definition of an Election Headquarters and that signage at headquarters be allowed anytime after the candidate has filed his or her nomination papers; and
- a setback of no closer than 15 metres be established at intersections.

These new rules take effect August 30th 2000.
