WATER DISTRIBUTION FLUSHING PROGRAM COMMUNITIES OF BALLANTRAE & MUSSELMAN LAKE

The Public Works Department reminds residents that it is conducting routine flushing operations of the Ballantrae/Musselman Lake municipal water distribution system.

The next flushing of the system is scheduled to resume on Monday October 23rd, 2000 and will be conducted between the hours of 9:00 am & 3:30 pm, and will be repeated every two (2) weeks until further notice.

This flushing is necessary to simulate normal operation of the system.

COMMUNITY OF STOUFFVILLE

The Public Works Department will be conducting a watermain flushing program throughout the Community of Stouffville, commencing Monday October 30th, 2000. This work will be conducted between the hours of 9:00 am and 3:30 pm and is expected to last until approximately Friday November 10th, 2000.

During the flushing operation discoloration of the water may occur and because of this we ask for your assistance by restricting the use of water to a minimum while the work is being conducted. Should discoloration of the water occur after the work has been completed let water run until it clears.

Questions and concerns regarding this operation should be directed to the Public Works Department.

PREPARE FOR A VICTORIAN CHRISTMAS

This adult workshop series runs for three weeks and participants will learn the history and origins of authentic Victorian traditions. The program runs in the afternoons from 1:30 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. from October 25 - November 11, 2000 and you may choose Wednesdays or Saturdays.

Week One: "Desserts and Candies"

The session will begin with an introductory talk, slide show, and tour of the Log Cabin and Victorian farm house, followed by a hands-on session in the farm house kitchen to create samples of such favourites as shortbread, sugar plums, and pastilles to take home.

Week Two: "Deck the Halls"

This session will cover 19th century decorations for the dining room or Christmas tree and each participants will create their own beaded and quilled ornaments.

Week Three: "The Tea...and More"

The final session will start with an interactive presentation on the Victorian Christmas tree and Christmas dinner traditions including table settings and menus. This will be followed with a traditional afternoon tea service (light lunch). Participants will receive printed summaries and instructions including authentic 19th-century recipes.
