Canada won just two of its six games. The most disheartening was a 68-56 loss to Slovakia, which deprived Canada of advancing to the top eight.

In assessing the tournament, Sutton-Brown thought the team's youth and lack of exposure to international competition were factors in its failure to bring home a medal.

rebounds, Sutton-Brown thought she held her own against some of the world's top players. The biggest adjustment, she said, was that the international game is far more physical than what she's accustomed to at the university level.

"I'm still young and learning, but I think I did okay. I hope to bring back a lot of that experience with me this year (at Rutgers)."
