Age: 35

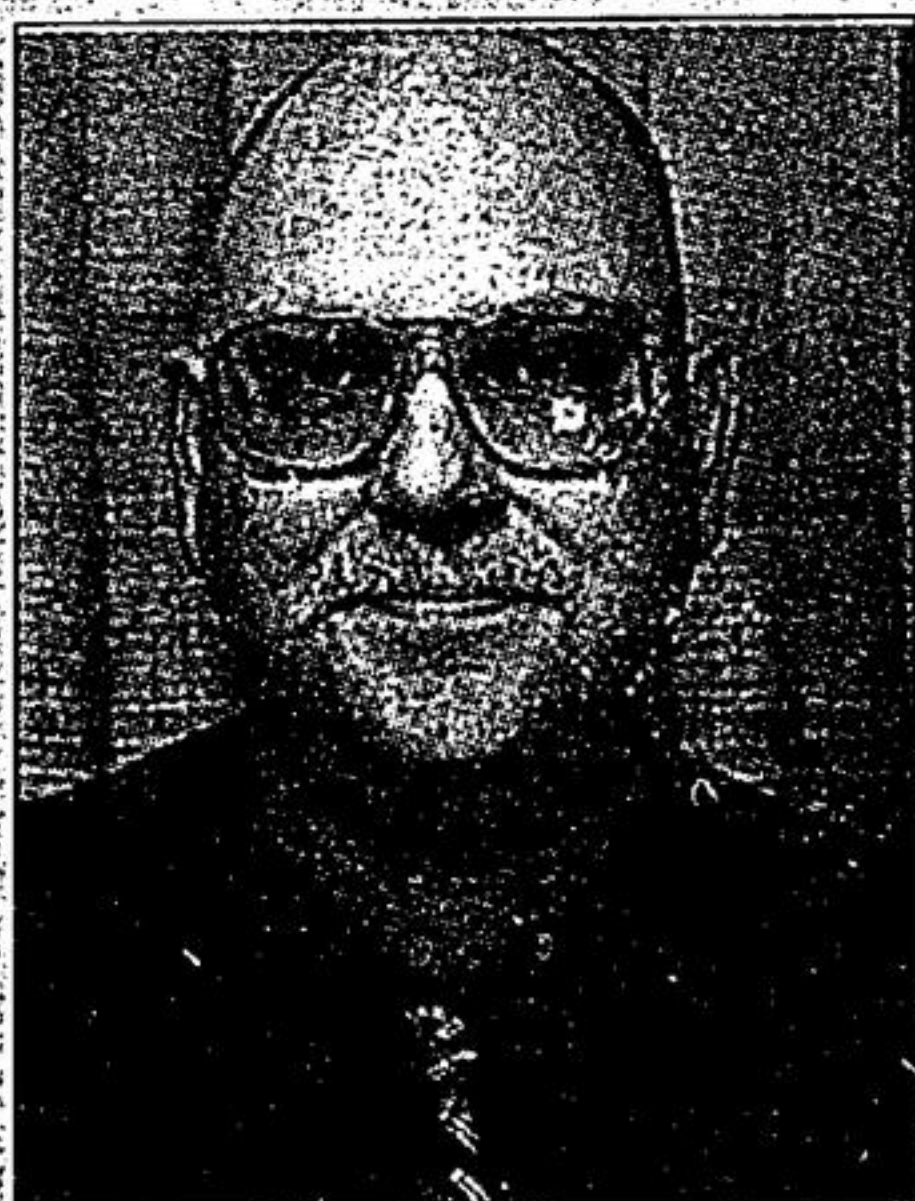
Family: Wife, Jane, Children, Michael and Zachary
