My first election assignment was a freelance job with CKLB Radio. Stationed at Oshawa City Hall, I was equipped with a head mike and power battery pack which connected to the radio station's newsroom. Across Durham region, there were eight free lance reporters in municipal offices doing exactly the same thing, with varying degrees of know how.

The drill was: on a rotation basis, a radio commentator introduced each of us from our respective municipality; each would give a two-minute update on who was winning, who was losing, who was cheering and who was crying. Ten minutes later, we'd do it all over again. It was a horrifying experience. I loved it. I was queen of the fake. No one knew I didn't know what I was doing.

The lingo went something like this: commentator: "Joan Ransberry will give us a report from Oshawa's City Hall. Come in Joan."
