

Markham Stouffville Hospital gets \$700,000 in new provincial funding

The Markham Stouffville Hospital is to receive more than \$700,000 as part of \$121 million the Ontario government is investing in health care services, but hospital president Dr. James Maclean says health care woes can't be solved by money alone.

Markham MPP David Tsubouchi announced from the hospital yesterday that the Markham funding will go toward orthopedics and the neo-natal unit. A total of 3,100 joint implants will now be funded across Ontario, but Maclean said that an increase in the number of doctors and nurses is needed first in order to perform the surgeries.

The Markham Stouffville Hospital itself will continue

to deliver the services it always provides, said Maclean. The new funding will now allow the hospital to meet its projected level of service as outlined in its 2000/2001 operating plan.

"It's recognition by the government that it has to now invest in health care, especially with an aging and growing population," said Maclean, who also serves as the hospital's CEO.

But he noted the growing and aging population means the province has to pay attention to the human resources needed to deliver proper services. This in part means ensuring that more people are properly educated and trained for health care jobs, he noted.

Tsubouchi, who is Ontario's solicitor general,

said that Queen's Park will keep investing in health care. Markham Stouffville Hospital provides high quality care, he said, and he will continue to advocate that the hospital be recognized for that.

Other priority areas that the government's multi-million dollar investment will go

to across Ontario include cardiac care, organ transplants and magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) machines. In Markham, the money for the neo-natal unit means the hospital will continue to specialize in premature births, meaning patients won't have to be transferred elsewhere.
