

# Markham man still missing

It's been four weeks now without a word from a missing Markham man and police are once again appealing to the public for information.

Robert Schickedanz, 43, of Lambert Road, left his job at a Port Perry construction site Nov. 21 and hasn't been seen or heard from since.

His car was found at his parent's Ruddington Avenue apartment building later that day but neither his folks, wife, brothers nor friends have had contact with him for close to a month.

"We're not thinking about foul play," said Det. Sgt. Paul Pedersen. "But people we have reached out to, friends and

family, have not heard from him. We're obviously trying to establish if he is choosing to be missing or if he's someone in desperate need of help or assistance."

Adding to police concern is the fact Schickedanz suffers occasional short-term memory loss and he had been having marital difficulties as well.

Pedersen said, "There has been some activity on his credit card, including a gas fill-up, but it was before the time the car was left at the parents."

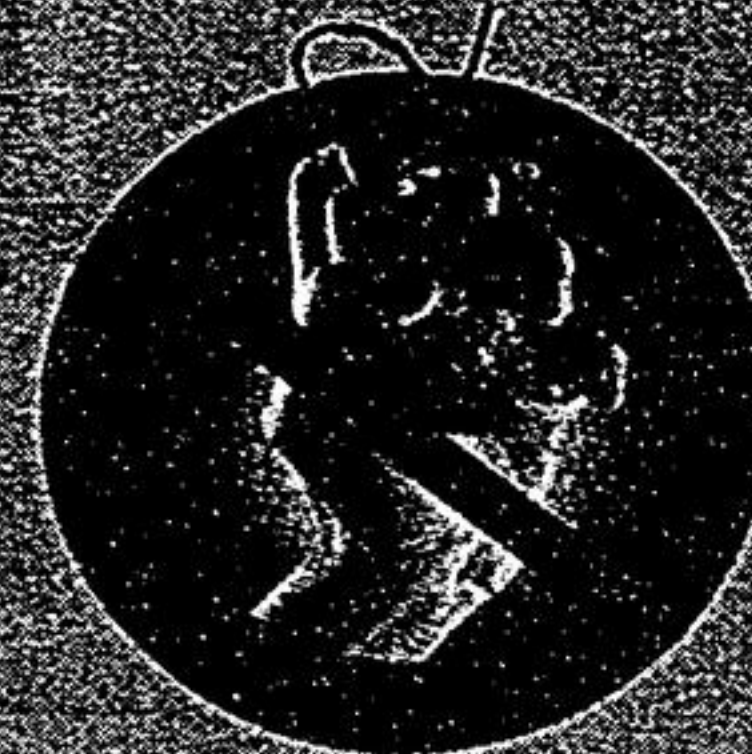
He left without a vehicle so a taxi may have picked him up, or a friend, Pedersen suggested.

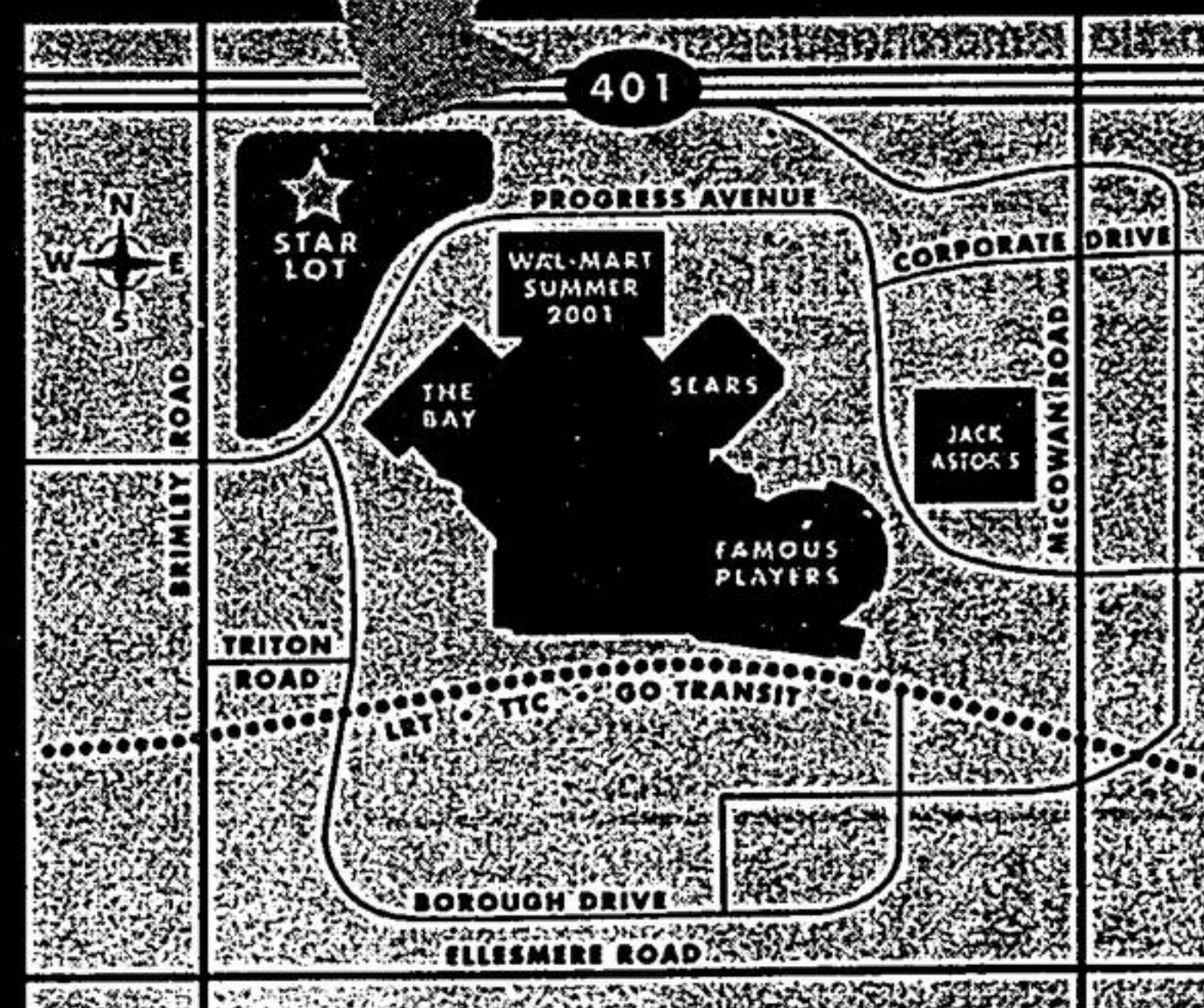
