ACCORDING TO STEVE NEASE

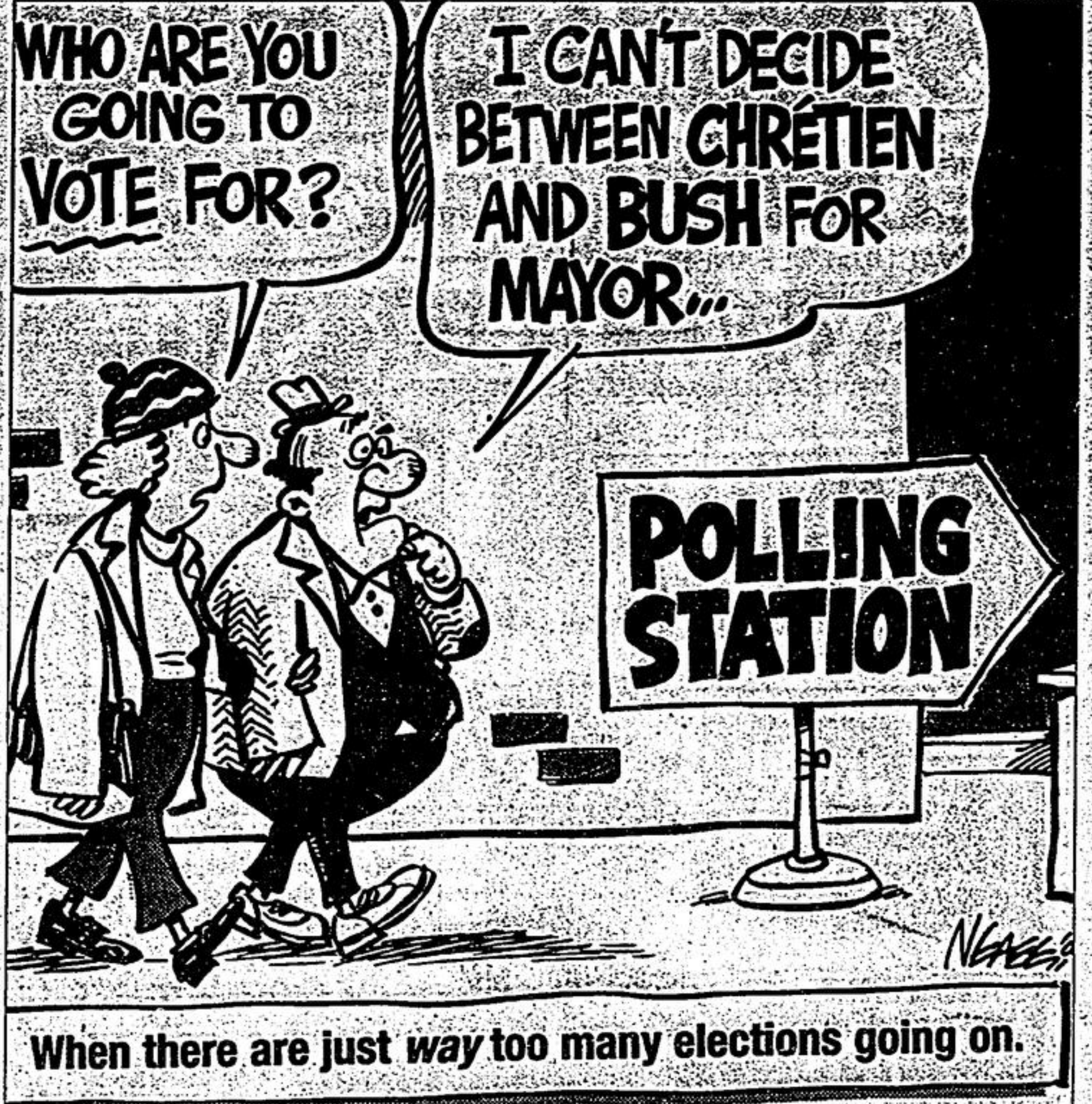


STEVE NEASE

They returned a Liberal majority government in the November event, giving Jean Chretien the mandate to govern for another, well, four or so years.

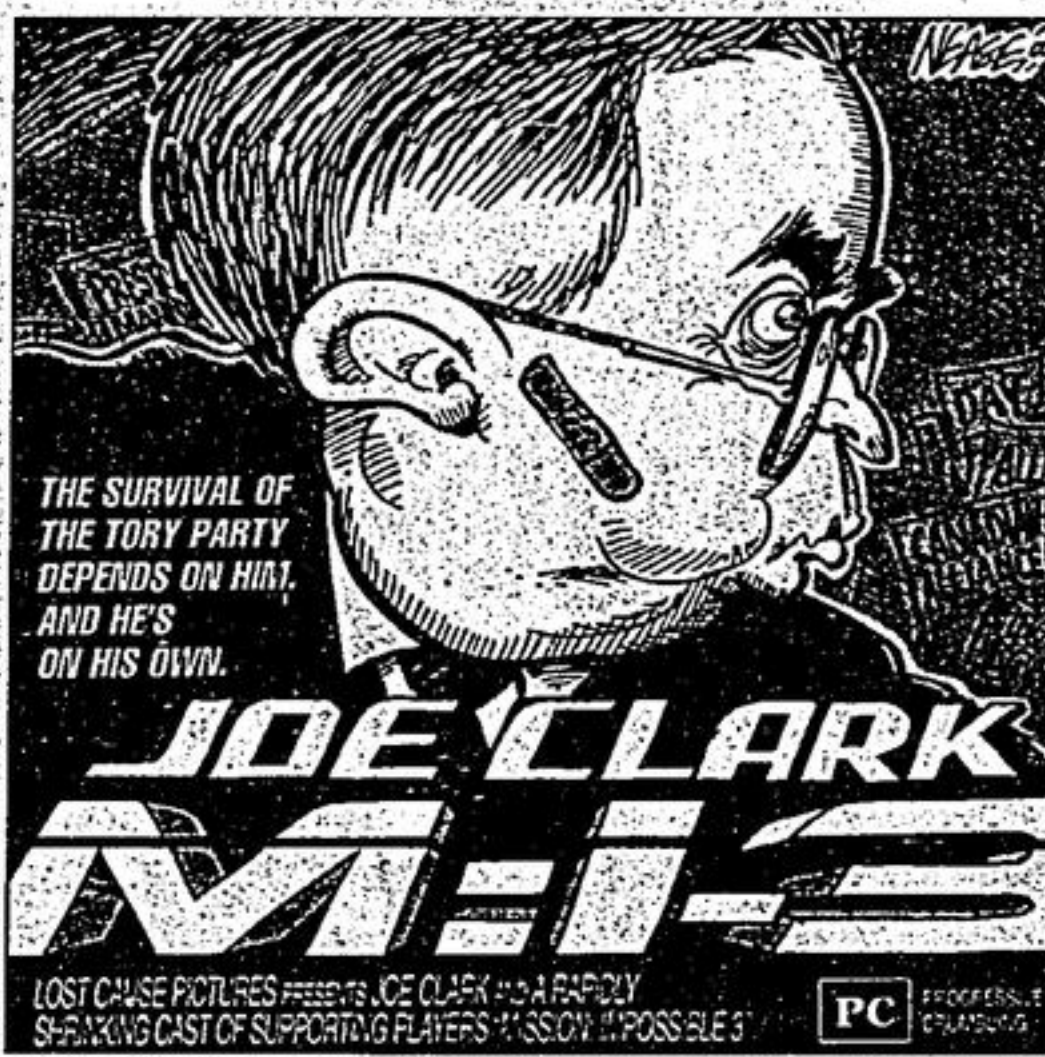
Award-winning editorial cartoonist Steve Nease found plenty of fodder along the campaign trail. These are some of his favourite cartoons from the election.

(Left) Joe Clark, a man on an impossible mission to save the Tory party.

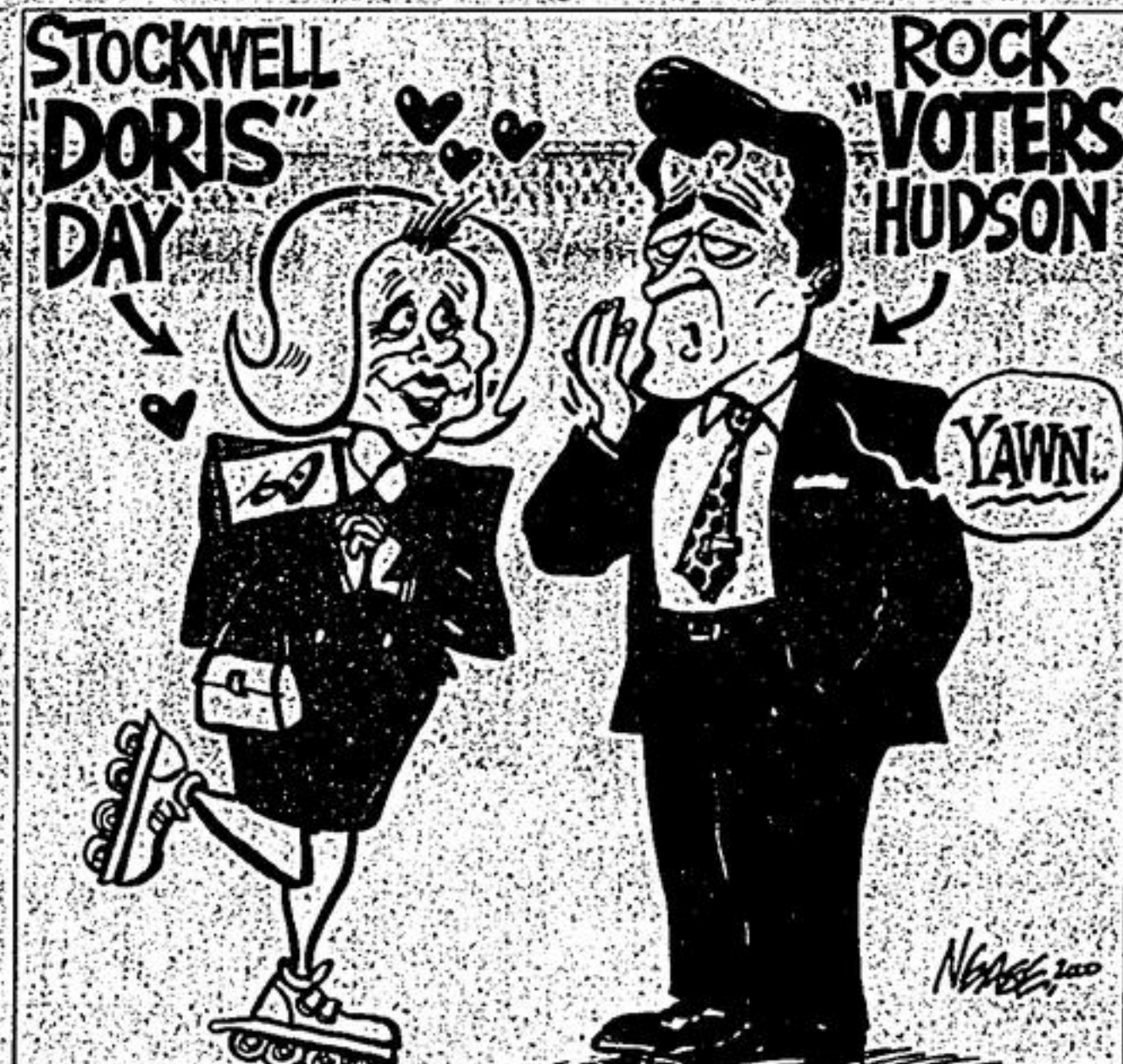


(Right) The evolution theory comes back to haunt Stockwell Day.
