Law should be changed to permit same-sex marriages

Same sex partners don't fit the country's legal definition of marriage, the Ontario government is, once again, reminding us.

I agree: Our criteria of marriage stipulate that the union must be between a man and a woman. The next step is obvious: change the law by changing the criteria.

If two gay people want to marry, why would the federal or the provincial government object? What's the point? Homosexuals should have equal rights in every aspect of life and this includes the right to marry.

I dearly wish our elected would quit caving in to our dearly beloved homophobes. Why do we let red-necked, mean-spirited people and those who simply fear the unknown define our laws? As well, Runciman is threatening to take the issue to the Supreme Court of Canada. Runciman mustn't have much to do if he's considering wasting his time and your tax dollars defending an outdated and unfair law.

Why am I not surprised that the Alliance Party of Canada has jumped into the fray? An Alliance MP from Saskatoon is charging Governor General Adrienne Clarkson with abusing her office because she sent a "best wishes" card to one of the gay couples.


