Green space 'concerns province'

"There are strong environmental causes and they should be looked at, but there are economic factors at work as well."

Murphy said GTA municipalities need to plan for an expected population increase of two million over the next 20 years.

Although Murphy has not read FON's greenway plan, he said each municipality has an official plan that developers must follow.

Developers are currently at an Ontario Municipal Board hearing appealing the Town of Richmond Hill's decision to prevent residential construction on a sensitive area of the moraine near Bond Lake at Yonge Street and Stouffville Road.

Although the new initiative would not affect the outcome of the hearing, it's the avoidance of OMB hearings that Glenn De Baeremacker, president of Save the Rouge Valley System, hopes FON's greenway plan will achieve.

"The strength of it is that it doesn't

look just at Richmond Hill, it looks at the entire moraine," he said. "It's the only way to protect the moraine."

Alexandra Gillespie, spokesperson for Hodgson, said the Oak Ridges Moraine will be examined under the province's Smart Growth initiative. She said Hodgson, who has only been housing minister for a few weeks, needs time to "get up to speed" on the various issues before making any comments.

"Unquestionably this government is concerned about green space across the province," remarked Gillespie.
