## A Father's Perspective

Jackie Kennedy is quoted as saying, "If we fail with our children, whatever else we may do well doesn't really matter."  
Perspective is so important. It would be well for parents on Father's Day to take time to reflect on what are our hopes and aspirations for our children and what are we doing to see that our family members are being equipped to achieve these goals.  
We ought to be concerned that they have an intelligent faith. This is more than an unthinking conformity to church traditions. They need to know why they believe the Bible is truth, a revelation from God of His designs for mankind. They need to know

who Christ Jesus is and what His life, death and resurrection can mean to them.  
Our children need to know themselves, not only having an honest evaluation of their interests and abilities, but also of the purpose and meaning of their lives. Only a proper understanding of why and how we have come to exist will provide this perspective for them. They need to know that we are more than the product of the blind chance interaction of molecules with no ultimate point to it all.  
They must be made aware of "the facts of life." Too many today are running aground by following an animalistic approach to life


As a result, meaningful relationships and happy homes are in decline. They need to know that true love is nourished by respect. It can't be bought or replaced by toys.  
Family members need to be warned about peer pressure. Conformity to sinful conduct and unnecessary nonconformity, or rebellion, against time-honored standards are equally unfortunate. It's important to know how to get along with others, but it's even more essential that they learn to respect God-honoring standards of conduct that will result in respect for themselves and respectful behavior toward others.  
We need idealistic goals for our families, complemented by our own exemplary

demonstration of how they work. To fail in these areas not only will be a serious breach of parental responsibility, but also can result in regrettable consequences both for them and for us.  
By teaching, and primarily by example, a wise father will seek to inculcate into his children's lives a sense of belonging, worth and meaningful life purpose. As the voice of Wisdom declared, "Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not depart from it." (Proverbs 22:6)
